## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An 1 act to promote the public health and safety by providing for 2 examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who 3 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, 5 students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the 7 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the 8 9 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," 10 further providing for eligibility requirements for 11 examination, for limited licenses and for requirements of a 12 School of Cosmetology. 13 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 15 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Sections 4(a), 5(a) and 6(a)(1) of the act of May 16 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, 17 18 are amended to read: 19 Section 4. Eligibility Requirements for Examination .-- (a) 20 No person shall be permitted by the board to receive a license 21 as a cosmetologist unless such person (1) shall be at least 22 sixteen years of age [and of good moral character] at the time of making application, and (2) shall have completed a tenth 23

- 1 grade education or the equivalent thereof, or in lieu of such
- 2 education or the equivalent thereof shall have received training
- 3 from or under the auspices of the Bureau of Rehabilitation in
- 4 the Department of Labor and Industry, and (3) shall have either
- 5 (i) completed not less than one thousand two hundred fifty hours
- 6 as a student in a duly registered school of cosmetology as
- 7 hereinafter provided in this act, or (ii) shall have been
- 8 registered and served as an apprentice at least two thousand
- 9 hours in a licensed cosmetology salon as hereinafter provided in
- 10 this act. The application shall be accompanied by a notarized
- 11 statement from either the licensed cosmetology school the
- 12 applicant attended or the licensed cosmetology teacher in the
- 13 licensed cosmetology salon where the applicant studied and
- 14 trained, stating that the applicant has completed the study and
- 15 training period required under this act.

- 17 Section 5. Limited Licenses. -- (a) An applicant for a
- 18 limited license shall be at least sixteen years of age, [be of
- 19 good moral character, ] have completed a tenth grade education or
- 20 the equivalent thereof and pay the applicable fee to the board.
- 21 \* \* \*
- 22 Section 6. Requirements of a School of Cosmetology.--(a) No
- 23 school of cosmetology shall be granted a license or renewal of a
- 24 license unless it shall:
- 25 (1) Enroll only those students who:
- 26 (i) Have completed an eighth grade education or the
- 27 equivalent or, in lieu of such education or equivalent, have
- 28 received training from or under the auspices of the Bureau of
- 29 Rehabilitation in the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 30 [(ii) Are of good moral character.]

- 1 (iii) Are free from contagious or infectious disease.

- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
