AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 4 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 7 8 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," in ballots, further providing for form of 11 ballots, printing ballots, stubs and numbers; in voting 12 machines, further providing for form of ballot labels on 13 voting machines; and, in electronic voting systems, further 14 providing for forms. 15 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17 hereby enacts as follows: 18 Section 1. Section 1004 of the act of June 3, 1937 19 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended to read: 20 Section 1004. Form of Ballots; Printing Ballots; Stubs; 21 22 Numbers. -- [From] (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), from 23 the lists furnished by the Secretary of the Commonwealth under 24 the provisions of sections 915 and 984, and from petitions and

papers filed in their office, the county election board shall

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- 1 print the official primary and election ballots in accordance
- 2 with the provisions of this act: Provided, however, That in no
- 3 event, shall the name of any person consenting to be a candidate
- 4 for nomination for any one office, except the office of judge of
- 5 a court of common pleas, the Philadelphia Municipal Court or the
- 6 Traffic Court of Philadelphia, or the office of school director
- 7 in districts where that office is elective or the office of
- 8 justice of the peace be printed as a candidate for such office
- 9 upon the official primary ballot of more than one party. All
- 10 ballots for use in the same election district at any primary or
- 11 election shall be alike. They shall be at least six inches long
- 12 and four inches wide, and shall have a margin extending beyond
- 13 any printing thereon. They shall be printed with the same kind
- 14 of type (which shall not be smaller than the size known as
- 15 "brevier" or "eight point body") upon white paper of uniform
- 16 quality, without any impression or mark to distinguish one from
- 17 another, and with sufficient thickness to prevent the printed
- 18 matter from showing through. Each ballot shall be attached to a
- 19 stub, and all the ballots for the same election district shall
- 20 be bound together in books of fifty, in such manner that each
- 21 ballot may be detached from its stub and removed separately. The
- 22 ballots for each party to be used at a primary shall be bound
- 23 separately. The stubs of the ballots shall be consecutively
- 24 numbered, and in the case of primary ballots, the number shall
- 25 be preceded by an initial or abbreviation designating the party
- 26 name. The number and initial or abbreviation which appears upon
- 27 the stub shall also be printed in the upper right hand corner of
- 28 the back of the ballot, separated from the remainder of the
- 29 ballot by a diagonal perforated line so prepared that the upper
- 30 right hand corner of the back of the ballot containing the

- 1 number may be detached from the ballot before it is deposited in
- 2 the ballot box and beside that corner shall also be printed,
- 3 "Remove numbered stub immediately before depositing your ballot
- 4 in ballot box."
- 5 (b) In all elections in a city of the first class where
- 6 there are more candidates than persons to be nominated or
- 7 <u>elected for a particular office and the same office appears on</u>
- 8 ballots in more than one ward, the order of the names of the
- 9 <u>candidates shall appear on ballots as follows:</u>
- 10 (1) In printing ballots for each ward, relative positions of
- 11 names for each nomination or office shall be changed as many
- 12 times as there are candidates for that nomination or office,
- 13 and, to the extent reasonably possible, a candidate's name shall
- 14 not appear at the top of the list more times than the name of
- 15 any other candidate.
- 16 (2) Names of candidates shall be arranged alphabetically by
- 17 <u>surname in the first ward. In the second ward, names shall</u>
- 18 appear in the same order as in the first ward, except that the
- 19 name at the top of the ballot in the first ward shall appear at
- 20 the bottom of the ballot in the second ward. The rotation shall
- 21 continue in the same manner for remaining wards.
- 22 (3) For purposes of this section, each absentee ballot shall
- 23 be treated as a separate ward.
- 24 Section 2. Sections 1110 and 1109-A of the act are amended
- 25 by adding subsections to read:
- 26 Section 1110. Form of Ballot Labels on Voting Machines.--

- 28 (n) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, the
- 29 names of candidates on a ballot shall be arranged in accordance
- 30 with section 1004(b).

- 2 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, the
- 3 <u>names of candidates on a ballot shall be arranged in accordance</u>
- 4 with section 1004(b).
- 5 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
