AN ACT

- 1 Establishing a task force on prostate cancer and related chronic prostate conditions: and providing for powers and duties of
- prostate conditions; and providing for powers and duties of the task force and the Department of Health and for prostate
- 4 cancer prevention and education strategies.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Prostate
- 9 Cancer Surveillance, Education, Detection and Treatment Act.
- 10 Section 2. Findings.
- 11 The General Assembly finds that:
- 12 (1) In this Commonwealth, prostate cancer is the most
- common type of cancer diagnosed in men.
- 14 (2) African-American men are 61% more likely than
- 15 Caucasian men to be diagnosed with prostate cancer and twice
- 16 as likely to die from it.
- 17 (3) One in six men will be diagnosed with prostate
- 18 cancer in his lifetime.

- 1 (4) In 2011, approximately 10,240 men were diagnosed 2 with prostate cancer in this Commonwealth. In that same year,
- 3 nearly 1,300 men died from prostate cancer.
- 4 (5) As of 2014, this Commonwealth does not provide or disseminate prostate cancer information as part of a public health campaign or message.
- 7 (6) Currently a lack of consensus regarding prostate
 8 cancer screening guidelines creates an environment of
 9 confusion leading to inconsistent screening rates across this
 10 Commonwealth.
- 11 (7) When diagnosed at an early stage, prostate cancer 12 survival rates are very high.
- 13 Section 3. Legislative intent.
- 14 It is the intent of the General Assembly:
- 15 (1) To provide the public with information and education 16 to create greater public awareness of the prevalence of and 17 measures available to detect, diagnose and treat prostate 18 cancer and related chronic prostate conditions.
- 19 (2) To ensure that:
 - (i) Medical professionals, insurers, patients and governmental agencies are educated about risk factors and screening guidelines.
 - (ii) Medical professionals provide patients with sufficient information about treatment options to enable patients to make an informed choice as part of informed consent and to respect the autonomy of that choice.
 - (iii) Commonwealth agencies provide unbiased information regarding screening, diagnosis and treatment options.
- 30 (iv) Uniform screening guidelines are established

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- for prostate cancer in this Commonwealth.
- 2 Section 4. Definitions.
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 4 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 6 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 7 "Health care professional." A licensed physician, a
- 8 physician's assistant, a certified registered nurse practitioner
- 9 or other licensed health care professional.
- 10 "Prostate cancer." Cancer that forms in tissues of the
- 11 prostate, a gland in the male reproductive system found below
- 12 the bladder and in front of the rectum.
- "Related chronic prostate condition." Prostatitis or benign
- 14 prostatic hypertrophy. The term does not include prostate
- 15 cancer.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Health of the Commonwealth.
- "Task force." The task force established by this act.
- 18 Section 5. Task force.
- 19 (a) Establishment.--The department shall establish a task
- 20 force on prostate cancer and related chronic prostate
- 21 conditions.
- 22 (b) Purpose. -- The task force shall investigate and make
- 23 recommendations to the department regarding:
- 24 (1) The prevalence of and measures available to detect,
- 25 diagnose and treat prostate cancer and related chronic
- 26 prostate conditions in this Commonwealth.
- 27 (2) Raising awareness about the long-term effects caused
- by a lack of public policy and education about prostate
- 29 cancer risk factors and screening guidelines.
- 30 (3) Development of a program of general public and

- 1 health care professional information and education regarding
- 2 prostate cancer, which shall include a uniform set of
- 3 screening guidelines and the broad spectrum of treatment
- 4 options regarding all stages of prostate cancer and related
- 5 chronic prostate conditions.
- 6 (4) Development of a program to ensure access to
- 7 prostate cancer screening for all men in this Commonwealth,
- 8 regardless of insurance coverage.
- 9 (5) Cooperation with the Insurance Department, the
- 10 Department of Aging and the Department of Human Services to
- disseminate the information required under paragraph (3) to
- 12 the general public.
- 13 (c) Members.--The task force shall be composed of the
- 14 following members:
- 15 (1) The secretary or a designee.
- 16 (2) The Secretary of the Commonwealth or a designee.
- 17 (3) The Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth or a
- designee.

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- (4) The Secretary of Aging or a designee.
- 20 (5) The Secretary of Human Services or a designee.
- 21 (6) One legislator from each of the four legislative
- caucuses, to be appointed by the President pro tempore of the
- 23 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, in
- consultation with the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader
- of the House of Representatives.
- 26 (7) Two physicians licensed in this Commonwealth who are
- knowledgeable concerning treatment of prostate cancer and
- 28 related chronic prostate conditions and who are board
- 29 certified in urology.
- 30 (8) Two physicians licensed in this Commonwealth who are

- 1 knowledgeable concerning treatment of prostate cancer and
- 2 related chronic prostate conditions and who are practicing
- 3 radiation oncologists treating prostate cancer.
- 4 (9) An epidemiologist licensed in this Commonwealth who has expertise in the treatment of prostate cancer.
- 6 (10) Two individuals who represent prostate cancer
 7 patient groups who may be prostate cancer patients or family
 8 members of a prostate cancer patient.
- 9 (11) One individual who is a prostate cancer patient or 10 family member of a prostate cancer patient.
- 11 (12) Two registered nurses licensed in this
 12 Commonwealth, one of whom is a certified registered nurse
 13 practitioner and both of whom are knowledgeable concerning
 14 prostate cancer and related chronic prostate conditions.
- 15 (d) Meetings.--

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- 16 (1) Within 45 days of the effective date of this
 17 section, the secretary shall appoint the members of the task
 18 force. The secretary shall appoint a chairman of the task
 19 force.
 - (2) The task force shall convene within 90 days of the effective date of this section and shall meet at least quarterly. When necessary, the task force may participate in meetings via teleconference.
 - (3) The task force shall issue a report with recommendations to the secretary within one year of its first meeting. The report shall also be transmitted to the Public Health and Welfare Committee of the Senate and the Health Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 29 (4) Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit 30 the task force from making interim reports or taking interim

- 1 actions.
- 2 (e) Compensation and expenses. -- The members of the task
- 3 force shall receive no compensation for their services but shall
- 4 be allowed their actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 5 performance of their duties. Reimbursement shall be provided by
- 6 the department.
- 7 (f) Duties of department. -- The department shall:
- 8 (1) Develop a program of general public and health care
- 9 professional information and education regarding prostate
- 10 cancer that shall include a uniform set of screening
- 11 quidelines and the broad spectrum of treatment options
- 12 regarding all stages of prostate cancer and related chronic
- 13 prostate conditions.
- 14 (2) Develop a program to ensure access to prostate
- cancer screening for all men in this Commonwealth, regardless
- of insurance coverage.
- 17 (3) Cooperate with the Insurance Department, the
- Department of Aging and the Department of Human Services to
- disseminate the information required under paragraph (1) to
- 20 medical professionals and the general public.
- 21 (4) Cooperate with professional associations of health
- care professionals to provide the education program for
- professionals required under paragraph (1).
- 24 (5) Identify and apply for public and private grants and
- funding in order to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 26 Section 6. Effective date.
- 27 This act shall take effect immediately.
