AN ACT

Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for 2 definitions; in registration system, further providing for 3 departmental responsibilities and for SURE system; in voter 4 registration, further providing for methods of voter 5 registration and for application with driver's license 6 application, providing for Commonwealth agencies and other 7 entities and further providing for time, for preparation and 8 distribution of applications and for approval of registration 9 applications; and providing for privacy and security 10 standards for voter registration in this Commonwealth. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The definitions of "applicant," "registration 15 card" and "registration records" in section 1102 of Title 25 of 16 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section is amended by adding a definition to read: 17 18 § 1102. Definitions. 19 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent 20 provisions of this part which are applicable to specific provisions of this part, the following words and phrases when 21 22 used in this part shall have the meanings given to them in this

1 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 2 "Applicant." An individual who is automatically registered 3 or who applies to be registered to vote as provided for in this 4 part. * * * 5 "Employment or program application." All of the following: 6 (1) An application for employment filed with any of the 7 following: 8 9 (i) The Bureau of State Employment. (ii) An independent agency of this Commonwealth. 10 (iii) The State Civil Service Commission. 11 12 (2) An application for any financial assistance, 13 compensation, benefit or service available, offered or to 14 which the person is entitled pursuant to any program administered by the following: 15 16 (i) The Department of Aging. (ii) The Department of Health. 17 (iii) The Department of Human Services. 18 19 (iv) The Insurance Department. 20 (v) The Department of Labor and Industry. 21 (vi) The Department of Military and Veterans 22 Affairs. 23 (vii) The Department of Revenue. 24 (viii) The Treasury Department. 25 (ix) The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency. 26 (x) Any other offices in this Commonwealth that 27 provide public assistance or that provide State-funded 28 programs primarily engaged in providing services to low-29 income individuals, the elderly or persons with 30 disabilities.

7	"Registration card." A registration record, including an
8	electronic record, containing all information required on the
9	registration application, including the elector's signature or
10	electronic signature, and suitable space for the insertion by
11	the appropriate official of the following information:
12	(1) The ward and election district of residence.
13	(2) The registrant's street address.
14	(3) Data required to be given upon removal from the
15	registrant's residence.
16	(4) The date of each election at which the registrant
17	votes.
18	(5) The number and letter of the stub of the ballot
19	issued to the registrant or the registrant's number in the
20	order of admission to the voting machines.
21	(6) The initials of the election officer who enters the
22	record of voting in the district register.
23	(7) Whether the registrant needs assistance to vote and,

3 § 1323. [Application] Automatic registration with driver's
4 license application.

5 (a) General rule.--

6 (1) The Department of Transportation shall provide for 7 simultaneous [application for] voter registration in 8 conjunction with the process under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510 9 (relating to issuance and content of driver's license). An 10 application under this subsection shall serve as an 11 application to register to vote unless the applicant fails to 12 sign the voter registration application.

13 (1.1) The secretary shall prescribe a procedure and 14 schedule by which the Department of Transportation shall 15 collect voter information and provide to the department 16 electronic registration records containing the legal name,

17 age, residence and the electronic signature of each

18 <u>individual who reports being a citizen of the United States</u>,

19 <u>is subject to penalties under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to</u> 20 unsworn falsification to authorities) and meets

21 <u>qualifications identified by the secretary.</u> The secretary has 22 the primary responsibility for implementing and enforcing the 23 driver's license voter registration system created under this 24 section. The secretary, in consultation with the Secretary of 25 Transportation, may promulgate regulations for implementing 26 this section.

27 (1.2) Upon receiving the electronic registration record
 28 for, and electronic signature of, a person described in
 29 paragraph (1), the secretary shall provide the information to
 30 the commission in which the individual may be registered as

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1	an elector under the laws of this Commonwealth and under the
2	National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (Public Law 103-31,
3	52 U.S.C. § 20501 et seq.). The commission shall provide each
4	individual with the process to:
5	(i) Decline being registered as a voter.
6	(ii) Adopt a political party affiliation, along with
7	information as to which elections require a political
8	party affiliation for participation.
9	(1.3) If an individual notified under paragraph (1.2)
10	does not decline to be registered as an elector within 21
11	calendar days after the commission issues the notification,
12	the individual's electronic registration record and
13	electronic signature submitted under paragraph (1.1) shall
14	constitute a completed voter registration application for
15	purposes of this chapter. The person shall be registered to
16	vote if the individual is eligible to vote under the laws of
17	this Commonwealth and is not already registered to vote.
18	(1.4) An individual notified under paragraph (1.2) who
19	does not decline to be registered as an elector within 21
20	calendar days after the commission issues the notification
21	and does not adopt a political party affiliation shall be
22	required to adopt a political party affiliation prior to
23	voting at the next primary election at which the individual
24	exercises his right to vote. If no such political affiliation
25	is adopted, an individual shall be permitted to vote at the
26	next election that does not require a political party
27	affiliation to participate.
28	(1.5) A commission may not send a ballot to, or add to
29	an elector registration list, an individual who does not have
30	a completed registration under paragraph (1.2).

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1 (2) An application for voter registration <u>or automatic</u> 2 <u>registration</u> submitted to the Department of Transportation 3 under this subsection shall be considered as updating any 4 previous voter registration information by a registrant.

5 Any change of address submitted to the Department of (3) 6 Transportation for the purposes of driver licensing or an identification card under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510 shall serve as 7 8 notification of change of address for voter registration for 9 the registrant involved unless the registrant indicates that the change of address is not for voter registration purposes. 10 Process.--11 (b)

(1) The Department of Transportation shall <u>both</u> provide
for an application for voter registration as part of a
driver's license application[.] <u>and collect voter</u>
<u>registration information as part of an application submitted</u>
<u>under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510 by an individual who meets the</u>
<u>qualifications to register under section 1301(a) (relating to</u>
<u>gualifications to register).</u>

19 (2) The format of the driver's license/voter
20 registration application and information to be collected
21 shall be determined and prescribed by the secretary and the
22 Secretary of Transportation[.] and shall include all the
23 requirements of an official voter registration application
24 specified in section 1327 (relating to preparation and
25 distribution of applications).

(3) The voter registration application portion of the
application shall contain all the requirements of an official
voter registration application specified in section 1327
[(relating to preparation and distribution of applications)].
The voter registration portion of the application:

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(i) may not require any information that duplicates
 information required in the driver's license portion of
 the form, other than a second signature; and

4 (ii) may require only the minimum amount of
5 information necessary to prevent duplicate voter
6 registration, to enable the commission to assess the
7 eligibility of the applicant and to administer voter
8 registration and other parts of the election process.
9 (c) Transmission.--

10 (1)The Department of Transportation shall forward completed applications or contents of the completed voter 11 12 registration applications in machine-readable format to the 13 department by the close of registration for the ensuing 14 election. The Department of Transportation shall forward the 15 electronic registration record containing the information set forth in subsection (a) (1.1) to the secretary as prescribed 16 17 by section 1201(2) (relating to departmental 18 responsibilities) regarding an individual who reports being a 19 citizen of the United States, subject to penalties under 18

20 <u>Pa.C.S. § 4904.</u>

21 [The] Upon receipt, the department shall transmit (2)22 the material to the appropriate commission within ten days after the date of its receipt by the Department of 23 24 Transportation. If a voter registration application is 25 received by the Department of Transportation within five days 26 before the last day to register before an election, the 27 application shall be transmitted to the appropriate 28 commission not later than five days after the date of its 29 receipt by the Department of Transportation.

30 (3) (i) Upon receipt of the completed voter

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1 registration information from the department, the commission shall make a record of the date of the receipt 2 of the application or electronic registration record and 3 process the application. No applicant shall be deemed 4 5 eligible to vote until the commission has received and 6 approved the application. Upon receipt of an electronic 7 registration record from the department, the commission 8 shall notify the individual of the process to: 9 (A) Decline being registered as a voter. 10 (B) Adopt a political party affiliation, along with information as to which elections require a 11 12 political party affiliation for participation. (ii) If an individual notified under subparagraph 13 14 (i) does not decline to be registered as an elector within 21 calendar days after the commission issues the 15 notification, the individual's electronic record and 16 17 electronic signature submitted under paragraph (1) shall 18 constitute a completed voter registration application for 19 purposes of this chapter. The person shall be registered 20 to vote if the individual is eligible to vote under the 21 laws of this Commonwealth and is not already registered 22 to vote. 23 (iii) A commission may not send a ballot to, or add 24 to an elector registration list, an individual who does 25 not have a completed voter registration under 26 subparagraph (ii). 27 (3.1) After the Department of Transportation is 28 connected to the SURE system and notwithstanding paragraphs 29 (1), (2) and (3), the Department of Transportation shall 30 transmit electronically the contents of a completed voter

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1 registration application within five days of receipt of the 2 application. The Department of Transportation shall transmit the electronic registration records of individuals who have 3 reported, subject to penalties under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904, that 4 the individual is a citizen of the United States and shall 5 contain the information set forth in subsection (a) (1) within 6 7 24 hours of collection of the information. Upon receipt of 8 the information from the Department of Transportation, a 9 commission shall, in the case of an application, make a 10 record of the date of the receipt of the application and 11 process the application in accordance with section 1328 12 (relating to approval of registration applications) or, in 13 the case of an electronic registration record, proceed in 14 accordance with paragraph (3). If the commission of the 15 county of residence has not been connected to the SURE 16 system, the Department of Transportation shall forward the 17 completed application or contents of the completed 18 application or the electronic registration record to the 19 department in accordance with paragraph (1). No applicant 20 shall be deemed eligible to vote until the commission has 21 received and approved an application in accordance with 22 section 1328.

(4) Changes of address shall comply with the following:

(i) Before the Department of Transportation is
connected to the SURE system, the Department of
Transportation shall notify the department of changes of
address received under subsection (a) (3). The department
shall notify the commission of the county of the
registrant's former residence. After the Department of
Transportation is connected to the SURE system, the

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1 Department of Transportation shall notify the commission of the county of the registrant's former residence. If 2 3 the registrant has moved to an address outside this Commonwealth, the commission shall verify the address 4 change in accordance with section 1901 (relating to 5 removal of electors). Except as provided in subparagraph 6 7 (ii), if the registrant confirms in accordance with 8 section 1901(d) that he has moved to another county, the commission shall cancel the registration and forward the 9 10 registrant's registration information to the commission 11 of the registrant's new county of residence. Except as 12 provided in subparagraph (ii), if the registrant has 13 moved to an address within the commission's jurisdiction, 14 the commission shall promptly update the registration record of the registrant in accordance with section 1328. 15 16 All changes of address received by the Department of 17 Transportation under this section at least 30 days before 18 an election must be processed by the commission for the 19 ensuing election. For the purpose of this paragraph, the term "registration information" means the registration 20 21 card and any other record of registration maintained by a 22 commission.

23 (ii) In the case of changes of address received by 24 the Department of Transportation which do not contain a 25 signature of the registrant, the commission receiving the 26 change of address notification shall mail a notice to the registrant at the new residence address requesting 27 28 verification of the address change. If the change of 29 address is to a new residence outside the commission's jurisdiction, the commission shall mail the following 30

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1 notice: 2 Date.... 3 Office of the Registration Commission County, Pennsylvania 4 (Address and Telephone No. of County) 5 6 We have been notified by the Department of Transportation 7 that you recently changed your address 8 from (old residence address) to (new residence address) and that this 9 10 change of address is to serve as a change of address for voter registration purposes. Unless you notify this 11 office within ten days from the date of this notice that 12 13 this information is not correct, your voter registration 14 will be transferred to County. You may notify 15 this office by writing your residence address, the date 16 and your signature on the bottom of this form and mailing this notice to this office. You need not notify this 17 18 office if this information is correct. 19 20 Chief Clerk If the address change is within the commission's 21 jurisdiction, the commission shall mail a voter's 22 23 identification card to the registrant at the new 24 residence address. 25 (iii) If the registrant does not return the notice 26 under subparagraph (ii) within the ten-day period, the 27 commission shall process the change of address according 28 to subparagraph (i). If the registrant notifies the 29 commission that the information is incorrect and the commission is satisfied with the registrant's explanation 30

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of the discrepancy, the address of the registrant's registration shall remain unchanged. If the verification notification or voter identification card is returned by the post office as undeliverable as addressed or with a forwarding address, the commission shall send a confirmation notice to the registrant's address of former residence in accordance with section 1901(d)(2).

8 (5) Upon notification and confirmation of any change of 9 address, a commission shall promptly update information 10 contained in its registration record.

(d) Prohibition.--[An] <u>The Department of Transportation may</u> <u>not register to vote under this section an</u> individual who is not a qualified elector [is ineligible to register to vote under this section].

(e) Effect.--Failure to properly complete a voter
registration application or refusal to provide voter
<u>registration information</u> shall not affect the validity of an
application for a driver's license, a renewal application or an
identification card application.

(f) Use of information.--No information regarding a
declination to register to vote in connection with an
application [made] <u>submitted or not submitted if an individual</u>
<u>has not certified that the individual is a citizen of the United</u>
<u>States, subject to penalties under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904,</u> under this
section may be used for any purpose other than voter
registration.

(g) Staff.--Agents and employees working on behalf of the Department of Transportation assisting in the completion of voter registration applications <u>or collecting voter registration</u> <u>information under this section</u> shall conduct themselves in a

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1 manner consistent with the following principles:

2 (1) They shall not seek to influence an applicant's
3 political preference or party registration or display
4 political preference or party allegiance.

5 (2) They shall not make a statement to an applicant or 6 take an action the purpose or effect of which is to 7 discourage the applicant from registering to vote <u>or</u> 8 <u>providing voter registration information</u>.

9 (3) Applicants wishing to register to vote under this 10 section shall be given the same degree of assistance with the 11 voter registration application as with all other Department 12 of Transportation forms.

Agency employees who violate this subsection <u>or who fail to</u> <u>collect the information required under subsection (a)(1) or fail</u> <u>to forward the information to the department or the SURE system</u> shall be removed from employment, provided that the agency at its discretion may impose a penalty of suspension without pay for at least 30 days, but not more than 120 days, if it finds that the violation does not warrant termination.

21	applicant or take an action the purpose of or effect of
22	which is to discourage the applicant from providing voter
23	registration information.

27	to provide voter registration information has any bearing
28	on the application, including its consideration, the
29	likelihood of employment or, in the case of an

11 In the case of voter registration with a motor (1)12 vehicle driver's license application under section 1323 (relating to [application] <u>automatic registration</u> with 13 14 driver's license application), if the valid application or 15 electronic voter registration application is submitted to the 16 appropriate Department of Transportation office or received by the department not later than 30 days before the date of 17 18 the election.

13 (2) Data required on the voter registration application

16 Any person who assists in the completion of the (3) 17 registration application shall sign the application and 18 indicate the person's address. (v) [Notice] For a paper application, notice that the commission will mail by nonforwardable mail to the applicant a voter's identification card upon acceptance of the application and that the applicant should contact the commission if the identification card is not received within 14 days from the date the application is sent to

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the registration office.

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(v.1) For automatic registration under section 1323, 2 1325 or 1325.1, notice that the commission will notify 3 the individual of the registration and that if the 4 5 individual does not decline to be registered as an elector within 21 calendar days after the commission 6 7 issues the notification, the individual's electronic 8 record and electronic signature submitted under paragraph (1) shall constitute a completed voter registration card 9 10 for purposes of this chapter.

registration or furnishing false information is perjury.
