AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for the declaration of a public health emergency, for duties of the Department of Health, for temporary regulations and for immunity from liability.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public Health
8	Emergency Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
14	"Executive agency." A department, board, commission,
15	authority, officer or agency or the Executive Department,
16	subject to the policy, supervision and control of the Governor.
17	"Government agency." Any of the following:

1 (1)An agency of the Commonwealth, including 2 departments, boards, commissions or authorities. 3 (2) A political subdivision or agency of a political subdivision. 4 5 (3) A local or municipal authority or other local government unit. 6 7 (4) A court or related agency. 8 "Public health emergency." An occurrence or imminent threat of a disease or condition of public health importance with both 9 10 of the following characteristics: 11 Is believed to be caused by any of the following: (1)12 A bioterrorist event, a biological, chemical or (i) 13 nuclear agent, a chemical attack or a nuclear attack. 14 (ii) The appearance of a novel or previously 15 controlled or eradicated infectious agent or biological 16 toxin. 17 (iii) A natural disaster, an accidental chemical 18 release or a nuclear incident. (iv) A disease outbreak, including an outbreak of 19 20 substance use disorder or unusual expression of illness. 21 (2) Poses a high probability of any of the following in the affected population: 22 23 (i) Death. 24 (ii) Serious or long-term disabilities. 25 Widespread exposure to an infectious or toxic (iii) 26 agent that poses a significant risk of substantial 27 present or future harm to the public health. 28 "Public health worker." A person employed by, under contract 29 with or serving as a registered volunteer of the department or a local health department to carry out prophylaxis, treatment, 30

6 "Secretary." The Secretary of Health of the Commonwealth.7 Section 3. Declaration of a public health emergency.

8 (a) Authorization. The secretary may declare a public <--
9 (A) AUTHORIZATION.-- <--

10 (1)THE GOVERNOR, ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE 11 SECRETARY, MAY DECLARE A PUBLIC health emergency by 12 disseminating the declaration promptly by means calculated to 13 bring its contents to the attention of the general public and 14 shall file it with the Legislative Reference Bureau for 15 publication under 45 Pa.C.S. Pt. II (relating to publication and effectiveness of Commonwealth documents) - AND WITH THE 16 <---17 DIRECTOR OF THE PENNSYLVANIA EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.

18 (2) WITHIN 72 HOURS OF RECEIPT OF A DECLARATION UNDER
19 PARAGRAPH (1), THE DIRECTOR OF THE PENNSYLVANIA EMERGENCY
20 MANAGEMENT AGENCY SHALL CONVENE THE PENNSYLVANIA EMERGENCY
21 MANAGEMENT COUNCIL TO PERFORM ITS DUTIES UNDER 35 PA.C.S. CH.
22 73 (RELATING TO COMMONWEALTH SERVICES) AND CONSISTENT WITH
23 DISASTER DECLARATIONS ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR.

24 (b) Declaration, renewal and termination.--

(1) The declaration of a public health emergency shall
be valid for a period of up to 90 days unless renewed or
terminated by the GOVERNOR, ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE
secretary by publishing a subsequent declaration in the
Pennsylvania Bulletin. EXTENDED BY AFFIRMATIVE APPROVAL BY A <--
MAJORITY OF BOTH HOUSES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

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1 (2) The General Assembly by concurrent resolution may 2 terminate a public health emergency at any time. If the 3 Governor approves the concurrent resolution, or if 4 disapproved, the General Assembly repasses the concurrent 5 resolution by two-thirds of both houses, the Governor shall 6 issue an executive order or proclaim ending the public health 7 emergency declaration.

8 (c) Duties of department.--Upon a declaration under 9 subsection (a), the department is authorized to perform the 10 following duties:

11

(1) Suspend departmental regulations.

12 (2) Promulgate temporary regulations under subsection13 (f) to address the public health emergency.

14 (3) Require reporting, in the manner and form prescribed
15 by the department, relating to a disease, infection or
16 condition.

17 (4) Set forth the requirements for health care
18 facilities and licensed health care practitioners, INCLUDING <--
19 PHARMACISTS, to manage a disease outbreak or unusual
20 expression of illness.

21 (5) Authorize public health workers to dispense,
 22 administer, furnish or otherwise provide prescription
 23 medication for prophylaxis or treatment of a reportable
 24 disease or condition as necessary to prevent and control the
 25 spread of disease or condition.

26 (5) AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATELY TRAINED, LICENSED OR <--
27 CERTIFIED PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS TO DISPENSE, ADMINISTER,
28 FURNISH OR OTHERWISE PROVIDE PROPHYLAXIS OR TREATMENT FOR A
29 REPORTABLE DISEASE OR CONDITION AS NECESSARY TO PREVENT AND
30 CONTROL THE SPREAD OF DISEASE OR CONDITION.

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1 (d) Requirements. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of 2 law, all government agencies shall, at the request of the 3 department and to the extent not prohibited by Federal law, provide information as prescribed by the department during a 4 public health emergency. The department shall provide for the 5 frequency and format, which may include automated data 6 7 exchanges, for the collection of the information required under 8 this subsection.

9 (e) Confidentiality of information.--Any information 10 provided or collected under this section, EXCEPT FOR 11 NONIDENTIFIABLE AGGREGATED DATA, shall be confidential and is 12 not subject to public access under the act of February 14, 2008 13 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, and is neither 14 discoverable nor admissible as evidence in any civil, criminal 15 or administrative action or proceeding.

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16 (f) Temporary regulations.--The department may promulgate 17 temporary regulations regarding measures to reduce harm and 18 control disease. The temporary regulations are not subject to:

19 (1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of
 20 July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
 21 Commonwealth Documents Law.

(2) Section 204(b) of the act of October 15, 1980
(P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.
(3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act.

(g) Expiration and subsequent promulgation.--The temporary
regulations promulgated under subsection (f) shall expire 90
days following the end EXPIRATION OR TERMINATION of the
declaration of a public health emergency. Regulations adopted
after this period shall be promulgated as provided by law.

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1 (h) Suspension of regulations.--An executive agency, in 2 consultation with the department, may suspend a regulation that 3 prevents, hinders or delays necessary action in responding to a 4 public health emergency.

5 Section 4. Immunity from liability.

6 The provisions of 42 Pa.C.S. § 8331 (relating to medical good 7 Samaritan civil immunity), 8332 (relating to emergency response 8 provider and bystander good Samaritan civil immunity) or 8332.4 9 (relating to volunteer-in-public-service negligence standard) 10 shall apply to any person who provides assistance in carrying 11 out the provisions of this act.

12 Section 5. Prohibitions.

13 The prohibitions under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6107 (relating to 14 prohibited conduct during emergency) do not apply to a 15 declaration of a public health emergency under this act. 16 Section 6. Effective date.

17 This act shall take effect immediately.

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
