AN ACT

Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; 2 providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing 3 for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction 4 of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and 5 transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal 6 property and the subject of theft; providing for the abandonment of animals; providing for the assessment of 7 8 damages done to animals; providing for payment of damages by 9 the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the 10 owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and 11 duties on certain State and local officers and employees; 12 providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted Account," in licenses, tags and kennels, further providing 13 14 15 for compensation and for applications for dog licenses, fees and penalties. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. Section 200(b) of the act of December 7, 1982 20 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, is amended to read: 21 Section 200. Issuance of dog licenses; compensation; proof 22 required; deposit of funds; records; license sales; 23 rules and regulations; failure to comply; unlawful 24 acts; penalty. 25

(b) Compensation. --

(1) For services rendered in collecting and paying over dog license fees, agents, for as long as they continue to act in that capacity, may collect and retain [a sum equal to the cost of a postage stamp plus \$1] the following amounts for each dog license sold, which [amount] amounts shall be full compensation for services rendered by them under this act[.]:

(i) Beginning on the effective date of this subparagraph and continuing for one year, the amount shall be:

(A) \$2.

(B) \$3, for each lifetime license sold.

(ii) Beginning one year from the effective date of this subparagraph, the secretary shall have the authority to establish by regulation the amount of compensation collected. The amount established shall be only that which is required to cover the reasonable and necessary expenses of administering the duties provided in this act. The amounts shall reflect the increased administrative duties imposed in selling a lifetime dog license and shall provide for compensation to the county treasurer and agents under subsection (a)(1), (4) and (5).

The compensation shall be retained by the respective agents and shall cover, among other things, the cost of processing and issuing dog licenses, postage, mailing, returns and bonding of the agents. A magisterial district judge authorized by the county treasurer to process applications for dog license certificates and issue dog license certificates is not authorized to collect

- 2 (a)(3) and (5) shall collect an additional 50¢ which shall be
- 3 remitted to the county treasurer, for the use of the county,
- 4 in the same manner as records are forwarded under subsection

- 7 Section 2. Section 201(a) and (b) of the act are amended and
- 8 the section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 9 Section 201. Applications for dog licenses; fees; penalties.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b), on
- 11 or before January 1 of each year, the owner of any dog, [three
- 12 months] eight weeks of age or older, except as hereinafter
- 13 provided, shall apply to the county treasurer of his respective
- 14 county or an agent under section 200(a), on a form prescribed by
- 15 the department, for the appropriate license for the dog. The
- 16 application and license certificate shall state the breed, sex,
- 17 age, color and markings of the dog, the name, address and
- 18 telephone number of the owner and the year of licensure. The
- 19 application shall be accompanied by the appropriate license fee.

A vanity or collector tag shall not be issued without approval 13 14 of the department.] (a.1) Fee schedule. -- Beginning on the effective date of this 15 16 subsection and continuing for at least one year, the license fees shall be as follows: 17 18 (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2), the 19 fees shall be: 20 (i) \$10. 21 (ii) \$49, for a lifetime license fee. (2) For Pennsylvania residents who are at least 65 years 22 23 of age and persons with disabilities, the fees shall be: 24 (i) \$7. 25 (ii) \$33, for a lifetime license fee. 26 (a.2) Regulations. -- Beginning one year from the effective date of this subsection, the department may promulgate 27

duties under this act. The department shall establish separate

regulations to adjust the dog license fees under this section.

The fees shall meet the reasonable expenses of administering the

- 1 <u>fees for Pennsylvania residents who are at least 65 years of age</u>
- 2 and persons with disabilities.
- 3 (a.3) Applicability. -- Compensation, if collected under
- 4 section 200(b), shall be paid by all applicants, regardless of
- 5 age, disability or type of license.
- 6 (a.4) Vanity and collector tags. -- All additional costs of a
- 7 <u>vanity or collector tag issued under this section shall be in</u>
- 8 addition to the required fee under this section. The additional
- 9 cost shall be distributed equally between the county treasurer
- 10 who issued the license and the Dog Law Restricted Account. A
- 11 vanity or collector tag may not be issued without approval of
- 12 the department.
- 13 (b) Lifetime license. -- The owner of any dog [three months of
- 14 age or older] which has been permanently identified may apply to
- 15 the county treasurer of his respective county or an agent under
- 16 section 200(a), on a form prescribed by the department for a
- 17 lifetime license for such a dog. Except as otherwise provided in
- 18 this act, a dog which has been issued a lifetime license shall
- 19 be required to wear a license tag. The application and license
- 20 certificate shall state the breed, sex, age, color and markings
- 21 of such dog, the type and number of permanent identification and
- 22 the name, address and telephone number of the owner. The
- 23 application shall be accompanied by the appropriate license fee
- 24 [as follows:
- (1) For each neutered male dog and for each spayed
- female dog for which the certificate of a licensed doctor of
- veterinary medicine or the affidavit of the owner is
- produced, the lifetime license fee shall be \$30.
- (2) For all other male and female dogs, the license fee
- 30 shall be \$50.

- For each neutered male dog and for each spayed female dog for which the certificate of a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine or the affidavit of the owner is produced, the license fee shall be \$20.
- (ii) For all other male and female dogs, the license fee shall be \$30.
- (4) Compensation, if collected under section 200(b), shall also be paid by all applicants, regardless of age or disability. A dog which has been issued a lifetime license prior to the effective date of this act shall not be subject to fees under this subsection.
- 14 (5) All additional costs of a vanity or collector tag issued under this subsection shall be charged in addition to 15 16 the fees under this section. The additional cost shall be distributed equally between the county treasurer that issued 17 18 the tag and the Dog Law Restricted Account. A vanity or 19 collector tag shall not be issued without approval of the 20 department] established under subsections (a.1) and (a.2).
