1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in reimbursements by Commonwealth and between school districts, further providing for Commonwealth reimbursements for charter schools and cyber charter schools.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 2591.1 of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
12	amended by adding a subsection to read:
13	Section 2591.1. Commonwealth Reimbursements for Charter
14	Schools and Cyber Charter Schools* * *
15	(e) For the 2019-2020 school year and each school year
16	thereafter, the Commonwealth shall pay to each qualifying school
17	district with resident students enrolled in a charter school
18	entity a charter school tuition reimbursement which shall
19	consist of the following:
20	(1) If a school district's charter student index is greater

1	than the calculation that represents the eightieth percentile
2	for all school districts and the school district's median
3	household income index is greater than the calculation that
4	represents the seventy-fifth percentile for all school
5	districts, the school district shall receive a concentrated
6	charter population allocation calculated as follows:
7	(i) Multiply the school district's charter average daily
8	membership by the amount appropriated for the concentrated
9	charter population allocation.
10	(ii) Divide the product in subparagraph (i) by the sum of
11	the products in subparagraph (i) for all school districts with a
12	charter student index greater than the calculation that
13	represents the eightieth percentile for all school districts.
14	(2) If a school district's local charter index is greater
15	than the calculation that represents the eighty-fifth percentile
16	for all school districts, the school district shall receive a
17	local charter impact allocation calculated as follows:
18	(i) Multiply the school district's adjusted charter average
19	daily membership by the amount appropriated for the local
20	charter impact allocation. A school district's adjusted charter
21	average daily membership shall be calculated as follows:
22	(A) Divide the school district's local charter index by the
23	median local charter index for all school districts with a local
24	charter index greater than the calculation that represents the
25	eighty-fifth percentile for all school districts. The charter
26	adjustment for a school district calculated under this
27	subparagraph shall be determined as follows:
28	(I) If the quotient calculated under this clause is greater
29	than two (2), the school district's adjusted charter average
30	<u>daily membership shall be two (2).</u>

1	(II) If the quotient calculated under this clause is less
2	than one-half (0.5), the school district's adjusted charter
3	average daily membership shall be one-half (0.5).
4	(III) If the quotient calculated under this clause is less
5	than two (2) and greater than one-half (0.5), the school
6	district's adjusted charter average daily membership shall be
7	the quotient calculated under this clause.
8	(B) Multiply the amount calculated under clause (A) by the
9	school district's charter average daily membership.
10	(ii) Divide the product in subparagraph (i) by the sum of
11	the products in subparagraph (i) for all school districts with a
12	local charter index greater than the calculation that represents
13	the eighty-fifth percentile for all school districts.
14	(3) Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the total
15	amount appropriated by the Commonwealth for the charter school
16	tuition reimbursement shall be divided equally between the
17	concentrated charter population allocation and the local charter
18	impact allocation.
19	(4) The amount calculated for a qualifying school district
20	under paragraph (1) or (2) shall not exceed one million five
21	<u>hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000).</u>
22	(5) For purposes of this subsection:
23	(i) The term "board authority ratio" shall mean a number
24	calculated by multiplying a school district's index calculated
25	under section 302 of the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess.,
26	P.L.1873, No.1), known as the "Taxpayer Relief Act," by the
27	<u>school district's property tax ratio.</u>
28	(ii) The term "charter cost ratio" shall mean a school
29	district's average annual change in charter school tuition paid,
30	for the five (5) most recent years for which data is available,

1	to be calculated by the average of the quotients calculated as
2	follows:
3	(A) For each of the five (5) school years, subtract the
4	school district's total charter school tuition paid in one (1)
5	school year from the amount paid by the school district in the
6	subsequent school year.
7	(B) Divide each amount calculated in clause (A) by the
8	school district's total operating expenditures reported for the
9	same subsequent school year used in clause (A).
10	(iii) The term "charter average daily membership" shall mean
11	a school district's average daily membership for students
12	enrolled in a charter school entity.
13	<u>(iv) The term "charter school entity" shall mean a charter</u>
14	school, cyber charter school or regional charter school as
15	defined in section 1703-A.
16	(v) The term "charter student index" shall mean a number_
17	calculated by dividing the average daily membership for a school
18	district's students enrolled in a charter school entity by the
19	school district's total average daily membership from the same
20	<u>school year.</u>
21	(vi) The term "local charter index" shall mean a number
22	calculated by dividing a school district's charter cost ratio by
23	the school district's board authority ratio.
24	(vii) The term "median household income index" shall mean a
25	number calculated the same as prescribed under section 2502.53.
26	(viii) The term "property tax ratio" shall mean a school
27	district's average, for the five (5) most recent school years
28	for which data is available, of the quotients calculated by
29	dividing a school district's total property taxes collected
30	during the school year by the school district's total amount of
