8	Section 1. Section 4702(g) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania <	•

13	(g) ExceptionsThe following are exceptions to subsection-

16	(5) Emission inspection criteria for newest model year	
17	vehiclesA subject vehicle shall be exempt from the	
18	requirements for emission inspection for eight years after	

1	the vehicle is manufactured. A one-time certificate of
2	exemption shall be affixed to the subject vehicle for the
3	entire duration of the exemption and in a manner prescribed
4	by department regulation. After the eighth year, the subject
5	vehicle shall receive an emission inspection in accordance
6	with this section. The department shall notify the official
7	inspection stations on a periodic basis of vehicles exempt
8	from the requirements for emission inspection.
9	(h) Revised State implementation plan Within 60 days of
10	the effective date of this subsection, the Department of
11	Environmental Protection shall initiate the process for emission
12	inspection criteria for newest model year vehicles in the
13	vehicle emission inspection and maintenance program. The
14	following shall apply:
15	(1) The revised State implementation plan shall be
16	completed no later than January 1, 2020, and shall
17	convincingly demonstrate that the emission inspection
18	criteria for newest model year vehicles can maintain the
19	relevant standards without benefit of the emissions
20	reductions attributable to the vehicle emission inspection
21	and maintenance program.
22	(2) The Department of Environmental Protection shall
23	comply with Federal law during the process, including
24	ensuring that the revision will not interfere with attainment
25	requirements or reasonable further progress toward attainment
26	and that Federal funding is not negatively impacted as a
27	<u>result of the revision.</u>
28	(3) The Department of Environmental Protection shall
29	notify the chair and minority chair of the Transportation
30	Committee of the Senate, the chair and minority chair of the
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1	Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives, the
2	chair and minority chair of the Environmental Resources and
3	Energy Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority
4	chair of the Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of
5	the House of Representatives of the Department of
6	Environmental Protection's notification to the Environmental
7	Protection Agency.
8	(i) Notice of approval. Upon approval by the Environmental
9	Protection Agency under subsection (h), the Secretary of
10	Environmental Protection shall transmit notice of the approval
11	to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the
12	Pennsylvania Bulletin. The emission inspection criteria under
13	subsection (g)(5) shall apply 120 days following publication of
14	the notice.
15	(j) Antitampering inspections Notwithstanding the
16	provisions of subsection (g)(5), the eight most recent model
17	year vehicles shall be subject to visual antitampering
18	inspections for the presence of emissions control components
19	installed on the vehicle by manufacturers, which may occur
20	during the annual safety inspection.
21	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 120 days.

24	EMISSIONS MODELING ACT.
25	SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF PURPOSE.
26	THE PURPOSE OF THIS ACT IS TO DEVELOP VEHICLE EMISSIONS
27	MODELING SCENARIOS TO DETERMINE THE IMPACTS OF EXEMPTING NEW AND
28	RECENT MODEL YEAR VEHICLES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF
29	
	TRANSPORTATION'S VEHICLE EMISSIONS INSPECTION PROGRAM.
30	TRANSPORTATION'S VEHICLE EMISSIONS INSPECTION PROGRAM. SECTION 3. POWER AND DUTIES.

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1 THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 2 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, SHALL CONDUCT 3 APPROPRIATE VEHICLE EMISSIONS MODELING TO DETERMINE THE DURATION 4 OF AN EXEMPTION PERIOD THAT ENSURES COMPLIANCE WITH THE 5 PERFORMANCE STANDARD UNDER THE CLEAN AIR ACT (69 STAT. 322, 42 6 U.S.C. § 7401 ET SEQ.) AND UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL 7 PROTECTION AGENCY INSPECTION/MAINTENANCE PROGRAM REGULATIONS. 8 THE MODELING SHALL INCLUDE SCENARIOS UP TO AND INCLUDING THE 9 NEWEST EIGHT VEHICLE MODEL YEARS.

10 SECTION 4. REPORT TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

11 WITHIN 180 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE 12 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 13 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, SHALL REPORT THEIR 14 FINDINGS TO THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE TRANSPORTATION 15 COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE 16 TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE 17 CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND 18 ENERGY COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR 19 OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE 20 OF REPRESENTATIVES.

21 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

22 THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

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
