AN ACT

- Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in small and disadvantaged businesses, further 2 providing for policy, for definitions, for regulations, for 3 duties of department, for bonding and progress payments and for report to General Assembly and providing for small 4 5 business reserve program. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The heading of Chapter 21 and section 2101 of Title 62 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended 10 11 to read: 12 CHAPTER 21 13 SMALL AND [DISADVANTAGED] <u>DIVERSE</u> BUSINESSES § 2101. 14 Policy. 15 The policy of this Commonwealth is to assist small and 16 [disadvantaged] diverse businesses in learning how to do 17 business with Commonwealth agencies. The department shall 18 implement this policy in accordance with regulations promulgated 19 by the department.
- 20 Section 2. The definition of "disadvantaged business" in

- 1 section 2102 of Title 62 is amended and the section is amended
- 2 by adding definitions to read:
- 3 § 2102. Definitions.
- 4 Subject to section 2103 (relating to regulations), the
- 5 following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have
- 6 the meanings given to them in this section unless the context
- 7 clearly indicates otherwise:
- 8 ["Disadvantaged business." A small business which is owned
- 9 or controlled by a majority of persons, not limited to members
- 10 of minority groups, who have been deprived of the opportunity to
- 11 develop and maintain a competitive position in the economy
- 12 because of social disadvantages.]
- 13 "Diverse and disadvantaged businesses." As defined in
- 14 <u>section 2201 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 15 "Diverse business." A department-verified business,
- 16 <u>including</u>, but not limited to, a service-disabled veteran-owned
- 17 <u>business</u>, <u>veteran-owned business</u>, <u>women-owned business or</u>
- 18 minority-owned business which has in place a diversity plan for
- 19 vendors and subcontractors.
- 20 "Service-disabled." As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601
- 21 (relating to definitions).
- "Service-disabled veteran-owned small business." As defined
- 23 in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601.
- 24 * * *
- 25 "Small diverse business." A business which is both a diverse
- 26 business and a small business.
- 27 "Veteran." As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601.
- 28 <u>"Veteran-owned small business."</u> As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. §
- 29 9601.
- 30 Section 3. Sections 2103, 2104, 2105 and 2107 of Title 62

- 1 are amended to read:
- 2 § 2103. Regulations.
- 3 The department shall establish policy for executive and those
- 4 independent agencies for which the department acts as purchasing
- 5 agency and may promulgate regulations establishing detailed
- 6 definitions of the words and phrases defined in [section 2102]
- 7 <u>sections 2102 (relating to definitions) and 2201</u> (relating to
- 8 definitions) using, in addition to the criteria set forth in
- 9 [section 2102] sections 2102 and 2201, other criteria as it
- 10 deems appropriate, including the number of employees and the
- 11 dollar volume of business. The policy shall give priority for
- 12 procurement to small diverse businesses. However, if there are
- 13 no small diverse businesses available to fulfill the procurement
- 14 requirements or the bids submitted by small diverse businesses
- 15 exceed an amount that is 125% of the budgeted amount, the
- 16 <u>department may solicit bids from diverse and disadvantaged</u>
- 17 business as defined and verified by the department in accordance
- 18 with sections 2201 and 2202 (relating to woman-owned business,
- 19 <u>minority-owned business or veteran-owned business).</u> State-
- 20 affiliated entities shall implement the policy for their
- 21 procurement programs.
- 22 § 2104. Duties of department.
- 23 The department shall have the following duties:
- 24 (1) Where feasible, provide appropriate staff who shall
- 25 be responsible to the department and who shall serve within
- 26 designated Commonwealth agencies to assist small [and
- disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in this Commonwealth in
- learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies.
- 29 (2) Give special publicity to procurement procedures and
- 30 issue special publications designed to assist small [and

- disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies.
 - (3) Compile, maintain and make available source lists of small [and disadvantaged] diverse businesses and diverse and disadvantaged businesses for the purpose of encouraging procurement from small diverse businesses or diverse and disadvantaged businesses.
 - (4) Include small <u>diverse businesses</u> and <u>diverse and</u> disadvantaged businesses on solicitation mailing lists.
 - (5) Assure that small [and disadvantaged] diverse businesses are solicited on each procurement for which the businesses may be suited. If there are not any small diverse businesses suited then open the solicitation to diverse businesses.
 - (6) Develop special training programs to assist small [and disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies.
 - (7) Assure that the participation by diverse businesses is, if appropriate, factored into the evaluation of proposals for supplies, services or construction when a purchasing agency uses the competitive sealed proposals method under section 513 (relating to competitive sealed proposals).
- 23 (8) Verify the current certification of a business
 24 seeking diverse verification of diverse businesses.
- 25 § 2105. Bonding and progress payments.
- 26 (a) Bonding.--Notwithstanding other provisions of this part,
- 27 a purchasing agency may reduce the level or change the types of
- 28 bonding normally required or accept alternative forms of
- 29 security to the extent reasonably necessary to encourage
- 30 procurement from small [and disadvantaged] diverse businesses.

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- 1 (b) Progress payments. -- A purchasing agency may make special
- 2 provisions for progress payments as it deems reasonably
- 3 necessary to encourage procurement from small [and
- 4 disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses.
- 5 (c) Exemption. -- For contracts under \$25,000, a small diverse
- 6 <u>business shall be exempt from the bonding requirements under</u>
- 7 subsection (a).
- 8 § 2107. Report to General Assembly.
- 9 The department shall annually, before October 1, report in
- 10 writing to the General Assembly concerning the awarding of
- 11 contracts to small [and disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses <u>and</u>
- 12 <u>diverse businesses</u> during the preceding fiscal year <u>on the</u>
- 13 <u>actual utilization of small diverse businesses or diverse</u>
- 14 <u>businesses as contractors and subcontractors</u>. The report shall
- 15 include a list of all small [and disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u>
- 16 businesses or diverse businesses that participated as
- 17 contractors, subcontractors or suppliers during the preceding
- 18 fiscal year. [for contracts if the number of contractors under a
- 19 previously existing contract for the same supply or service is
- 20 reduced to a single contractor or reduced by more than 50% of
- 21 the number existing on September 30, 2003. In preparing the
- 22 report, the department shall verify whether commitments made to
- 23 small and disadvantaged businesses in the course of awarding
- these contracts have been maintained.]
- 25 Section 4. Title 62 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 26 <u>§ 2109. Small business reserve program.</u>
- 27 <u>The department shall establish a small business reserve</u>
- 28 program for the purpose of increasing economic opportunities for
- 29 <u>small businesses and affording small businesses, including small</u>
- 30 diverse businesses, veteran-owned businesses and service-

- 1 <u>disabled veteran-owned businesses</u>, the opportunity to bid on
- 2 <u>Commonwealth agency contracts without competing with larger</u>
- 3 <u>businesses</u>.
- 4 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
