## AN ACT

- Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania
  Consolidated Statutes, in environmental protection, providing
  for polystyrene food container prohibition.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
  hereby enacts as follows:

  Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

- 1 § 4301. Purpose.
- 2 The intent of this chapter is to reduce the adverse
- 3 environmental impact of polystyrene food containers by
- 4 prohibiting a food establishment from dispensing prepared food
- 5 to a customer in a polystyrene food service container.
- 6 § 4302. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
- 11 <u>the Commonwealth.</u>
- 12 <u>"Food establishment."</u> All sales outlets, stores, shops or
- 13 <u>other places of business located within this Commonwealth which</u>
- 14 operate primarily to sell or convey food directly to the
- 15 <u>ultimate consumer</u>, which food is predominately contained,
- 16 wrapped or held in or on packaging. The term shall include, but
- 17 not be limited to, any place where food is prepared, mixed,
- 18 cooked, baked, smoked, preserved, bottled, packaged, handled,
- 19 stored, manufactured and sold or offered for sale, including,
- 20 but not limited to, any fixed or mobile restaurant, drive-in,
- 21 coffee shop, cafeteria, short order cafe, delicatessen,
- 22 <u>luncheonette, grill, sandwich shop, soda fountain, tavern, bar,</u>
- 23 cocktail lounge, nightclub, roadside stand, prepared food take-
- 24 out place, industrial feeding establishment, catering kitchen,
- 25 commissary, grocery store, public food market, food stand or
- 26 similar place in which food or drink is prepared for sale or for
- 27 service on the premises or elsewhere, and any other
- 28 <u>establishment or operation, including homes, where food is</u>
- 29 processed, prepared, stored, served or provided for the public
- 30 for charge.

- 1 "Polystyrene food service container." As follows:
- 2 (1) A single-use polystyrene foam food service container
- 3 such as a cup, bowl, plate and clamshell-style container in
- 4 <u>addition to a foam cooler that is not encased in another</u>
- 5 material.
- 6 (2) A single-use polystyrene solid plastic food
- 7 <u>container such as a cup, bowl, plate, clamshell-style</u>
- 8 <u>container, cutlery, straw and cup lid.</u>
- 9 "Prepared food." Food or beverage prepared for public
- 10 consumption by a food establishment using any cooking or food
- 11 preparation technique. The term does not include raw or uncooked
- 12 meat, fish or eggs provided for public consumption without
- 13 <u>further food preparation</u>.
- 14 "Retailer." A person that purchases or receives products
- 15 from any source for the purpose of sale to a consumer.
- 16 § 4303. Prohibition.
- 17 (a) Food establishment.--A food establishment is prohibited
- 18 from the following:
- 19 (1) Dispensing prepared food in or on a polystyrene food
- 20 service container.
- 21 (2) Selling, giving or providing eating utensils or
- 22 straws composed of polystyrene.
- 23 (b) Retailer.--A retailer is prohibited from selling, giving
- 24 or providing a polystyrene food service container except for the
- 25 following:
- 26 <u>(1) Meat trays.</u>
- 27 <u>(2) Egg cartons.</u>
- 28 (3) Packing materials.
- 29 § 4304. Complaints.
- The department shall prescribe a procedure for a person to

- 1 file a complaint with the department for a violation of this
- 2 <u>chapter</u>.
- 3 § 4305. Compliance.
- 4 The department shall develop and maintain a publicly
- 5 <u>accessible Internet website with all of the following:</u>
- 6 (1) A description of the information necessary to comply
- 7 <u>with the prohibition under section 4303 (relating to</u>
- 8 <u>prohibition</u>).
- 9 (2) A description of the procedure to file a complaint
- 10 with the department for a violation of the prohibition under
- 11 <u>section 4304 (relating to complaints).</u>
- 12 <u>§ 4306. Regulations.</u>
- 13 The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary
- 14 to implement the provisions of this chapter.
- 15 <u>§ 4307. Penalties.</u>
- 16 (a) Imposition. -- The department may impose a civil penalty
- 17 in the following amounts for a violation of this chapter:
- 18 (1) For a first violation, \$500.
- 19 (2) For a second violation, \$1,000.
- 20 (3) For a third or subsequent violation, \$2,000.
- 21 (b) Payment. -- Any civil penalty collected under subsection
- 22 (a) shall be paid to the department.
- 23 (c) Local law.--This chapter shall preempt any ordinance or
- 24 resolution passed or adopted by any political subdivision that
- 25 is effective on, before or after the effective date of this
- 26 chapter to the extent that the ordinance or resolution conflicts
- 27 or is inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter.
- 28 § 4308. Applicability.
- 29 This chapter shall apply to transactions consummated after
- 30 December 31, 2019.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
