8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. The act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45),
11	known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, is amended by
12	adding a section to read:
13	Section 306. Changing stations in public buildings or
14	facilities.
15	(a) Installation and maintenanceAn individual, agency,
16	corporation, partnership, company, organization, association or
17	other business entity that owns or manages a public building or
18	facility, a State-owned building or a health care facility shall
19	install and maintain at least one adult changing station for
20	persons with disabilities or special health care issues or the

1	elderly. Each changing station shall be accessible to both men
2	and women when the public building or facility is open to the
3	public and any of the following conditions are met:
4	(1) The public building or facility, State-owned
5	building or health care facility is constructed on or after
6	the date which is two years after the effective date of this
7	subsection.
8	(2) When an alteration or addition is made on or after
9	the date which is four years after the effective date of this
10	subsection to a public building or facility, State-owned
11	building or health care facility that existed before the
12	effective date of this subsection and:
13	(i) the alteration or addition requires a permit;
14	and
15	(ii) the estimated cost of the alteration or
16	addition is \$20,000 or more.
17	(b) SignageA public building or facility, State-owned
18	building or health care facility shall ensure that:
19	(1) the entrance to each adult changing station has
20	conspicuous signage indicating the location of the adult
21	changing station; and
22	(2) if the public building or facility, State-owned
23	building or health care facility has a central directory, the
24	central directory indicates the location of the adult
25	changing station.
26	(c) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
27	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
28	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
29	"Adult changing station." A private, enclosed family or
30	assisted-use toilet facility containing an adult changing table
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1	that is for use by older children, the elderly and adults with	
2	disabilities or special health care needs.	
3	"Adult changing table." A powered, height-adjustable table	
4	that shall:	
5	(1) Be able to lower to a height of no less than eight	
6	inches and raise to a height of no less than 34 inches.	
7	(2) Be at least 25 inches wide and at least 72 inches	
8	long.	
9	(3) Support at least 350 pounds.	
10	"Health care facility." A general or special hospital,	
11	including psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals and	
12	long-term care nursing facilities. The term includes both for-	
13	profit and nonprofit entities and includes those operated by an	
14	agency or State or local government. The term shall also include	
15	a hospice. The term does not include an office used primarily	
16	for the private or group practice by health care practitioners	
17	where no reviewable clinically related health service is	
18	offered.	
19	"Public building or facility." An establishment with the	
20	capacity to serve 1,500 or more persons per day, including an	
21	auditorium, convention center, permanent amusement park, movie	
22	theater, theater, concert hall, sports arena, stadium, shopping	
23	center or store of at least 40,000 square feet, museum library,	
24	park, zoo, airport, train station and bus station.	
25	"State-owned buildings." The Capitol Building, a building	
26	owned or managed by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania	
27	Courts, rest stops located on interstate highways and the	
28	Pennsylvania Turnpike and a public building or facility located	
29	on a State-owned or State-related college or university.	
30	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.	
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
