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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in Safe2Say Program, further 5 providing for definitions and for Safe2Say Program; in 6 postsecondary institution sexual harassment and sexual 7 violence policy and online reporting system, further 8 providing for definitions, for policy for postsecondary 9 institution sexual harassment and sexual violence and for 10 online reporting system; and making an editorial change. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 1302-D of the act of March 10, 1949 15 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a definition to read: 16 Section 1302-D. Definitions. 17 18 The following words and phrases when used in this article 19 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 20 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 <u>"Hate-based intimidation." A threat of physical injury, harm</u>
- 2 to property or other type of injury motivated by hatred toward
- 3 an individual's or group of individuals' actual or perceived:
- 4 <u>(1) race;</u>
- 5 (2) color;
- 6 <u>(3) religion;</u>
- 7 <u>(4) national origin;</u>
- 8 <u>(5) ancestry;</u>
- 9 <u>(6)</u> sex;
- 10 (7) gender or gender identity;
- 11 (8) sexual orientation;
- 12 <u>(9) intellectual disability;</u>
- 13 (10) physical or sensory disability; or
- 14 <u>(11) behavioral or mental health.</u>

- Section 2. Section 1303-D(c)(1) and (2) and (d) of the act,
- 17 added June 22, 2018 (P.L.327, No.44), are amended and subsection
- 18 (c) is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
- 19 Section 1303-D. Safe2Say Program.

- 21 (c) Program requirements. -- Beginning January 14, 2019, the
- 22 program shall be responsible for the following:
- 23 (1) To ensure anonymous reporting concerning unsafe,
- 24 potentially harmful, dangerous, violent or criminal
- activities, including, but not limited to, the reporting of
- hate-based intimidation, in a school entity or the threat of
- 27 the activities in a school entity.
- 28 (2) To establish protocols and procedures to promptly
- 29 notify the appropriate law enforcement agency via 911 centers
- 30 and the Pennsylvania State Police when the program receives

- an anonymous report of violent or criminal activities,
- 2 <u>including an anonymous report of hate-based intimidation</u>, in
- a school entity that poses an immediate threat of violence or
- 4 criminal activity.

- 6 (11) To train and provide instruction to employees of
- 7 school entities on how to recognize and report hate-based
- 8 <u>intimidation</u>.
- 9 (d) School entity. -- Each school entity shall:
- 10 <u>(1)</u> develop procedures for assessing and responding to
- reports received from the program[.]; and
- 12 (2) require each school in the school entity to
- 13 <u>incorporate into periodic in-service training sessions</u>
- 14 appropriate instruction in recognizing and reporting
- behavior, including hate-based intimidation, that could pose
- an immediate threat of violence or harm to students, a school
- or the community.

- 24 Section 4. Section 2001-J of the act is amended by adding a
- 25 definition to read:
- 26 Section 2001-J. Definitions.
- 27 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 28 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 29 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 30 "Hate-based intimidation." A threat of physical injury, harm

- 2 an individual's or group of individuals' actual or perceived:
- (1) race;
- 4 <u>(2) color;</u>
- 5 <u>(3) religion;</u>
- 6 <u>(4) national origin;</u>
- 7 (5) ancestry;
- 8 <u>(6)</u> sex;
- 9 (7) gender or gender identity;
- 10 (8) sexual orientation;
- 11 (9) intellectual disability;
- 12 (10) physical or sensory disability; or
- 13 <u>(11) behavioral or mental health.</u>

- 15 Section 5. Sections 2002-J and 2003-J of the act, added June
- 16 28, 2019 (P.L.117, No.16), are amended to read:
- 17 Section 2002-J. Policy for postsecondary institution sexual
- harassment [and], sexual violence and hate-based
- 19 intimidation.
- 20 (a) Adoption. -- A postsecondary institution shall adopt a
- 21 clear, understandable written policy on sexual harassment [and],
- 22 sexual violence and hate-based intimidation that informs victims
- 23 and students of their rights under Federal and State law,
- 24 including the crime victims bill of rights. No later than June
- 25 30, 2020, a postsecondary institution shall amend its current
- 26 policy on sexual harassment and sexual violence to include
- 27 provisions to govern hate-based intimidation.
- 28 (b) Report.--
- 29 (1) The sexual harassment [and], sexual violence and
- 30 <u>hate-based intimidation</u> policy under subsection (a) shall

- 1 include a provision that a witness or victim of an incident
- of sexual harassment [or], sexual violence or hate-based
- 3 <u>intimidation</u> who reports the incident in good faith will not
- 4 be sanctioned by the institution for admitting in the report
- 5 to a violation of the institution's student conduct policy on
- 6 the personal use of drugs or alcohol.
- 7 (2) Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prohibit
- 8 <u>a postsecondary institution from including a provision in its</u>
- 9 <u>sexual harassment, sexual violence and hate-based</u>
- intimidation policy to govern the receipt of reports from the
- 11 general public, provided that the public reports involve a
- 12 <u>student of the postsecondary institution.</u>
- 13 (c) Model policy.--The Department of Education shall develop
- 14 a model policy and make the model policy available to
- 15 postsecondary institutions. A postsecondary institution may
- 16 adopt the model policy as the policy of the institution on
- 17 sexual harassment [and], sexual violence and hate-based
- 18 intimidation.
- 19 Section 2003-J. Online reporting system.
- 20 (a) Establishment of online reporting system. -- A
- 21 postsecondary institution shall establish and maintain an online
- 22 reporting system to receive complaints of sexual harassment
- 23 [and] sexual violence and hate-based intimidation from students
- 24 and employees. A report shall be investigated through the
- 25 process established in the postsecondary institution's sexual
- 26 harassment [and], sexual violence and hate-based intimidation
- 27 policy. A postsecondary institution may not fail or refuse to
- 28 investigate an anonymous report because it is anonymous.
- 29 (b) Anonymous reports. -- The online reporting system shall
- 30 permit anonymous reports, which shall be investigated in

- 1 accordance with subsection (a).
- 2 (c) Required information. -- A postsecondary institution shall
- 3 provide students and employees making reports under this section
- 4 with the following:
- 5 (1) Information regarding who will receive and have
- 6 access to the reports filed.
- 7 (2) How information gathered through the online
- 8 reporting system will be used.
- 9 (3) Contact information for on-campus and off-campus
- organizations serving victims of sexual harassment [and],
- 11 sexual violence <u>and hate-based intimidation</u>.
- 12 (d) Statement. -- The online reporting system shall
- 13 prominently post the online system's policy regarding reports
- 14 and investigations of sexual harassment [and], sexual violence
- 15 and hate-based intimidation and shall encourage individuals to
- 16 review the policy for more information about procedures and
- 17 resources.
- 18 (e) Access to data. -- A postsecondary institution shall limit
- 19 access to the data collected, created or maintained under
- 20 subsection (a) to only the data subject and as follows:
- 21 (1) Only individuals with explicit authorization from a
- 22 postsecondary institution may enter, update, access, share or
- disseminate electronic data related to an incident of sexual
- harassment [or], sexual violence and hate-based intimidation
- 25 collected, created or maintained under this section.
- 26 (2) The ability of an authorized individual to enter,
- 27 update, access, share or disseminate data must be limited
- through the use of role-based access that corresponds to the
- 29 official duties or training level of the individual and the
- 30 institutional authorization that grants access for that

1 purpose.

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- 2 (3) Actions in which the data related to an incident of
 3 sexual harassment [or], sexual violence or hate-based
 4 intimidation are entered, updated, accessed, shared or
 5 disseminated outside the postsecondary institution must be
 6 recorded in a data audit trail.
 - (4) An institution shall immediately and permanently revoke the authorization of an individual determined to have willfully entered, updated, accessed, shared or disseminated data in violation of this section.
- 11 (5) An institution or individual implementing, operating 12 or working for the program may not be compelled to produce a 13 record except pursuant to a court order.
- 14 Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
