AN ACT

Amending the act of March 1, 1988 (P.L.82, No.16), entitled "An 1 act providing for the establishment, implementation and 2 administration of the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment 3 Authority; imposing powers and duties on a board of trustees; 4 transferring the rights, powers, duties and obligations of 5 the Water Facilities Loan Board to the Pennsylvania 6 7 Infrastructure Investment Authority; providing for the issuance of notes and bonds; providing for financial 8 assistance and for a comprehensive water facilities plan; 9 authorizing a referendum to incur indebtedness; making an 10 appropriation; and making repeals," further providing for 11 definitions and for financial assistance. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. The definition of "project" in section 3 of the 16 act of March 1, 1988 (P.L.82, No.16), known as the Pennsylvania 17 Infrastructure Investment Authority Act, is amended to read: Section 3. Definitions. 18 19 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 20 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 21 context clearly indicates otherwise: 22 * * * 23 "Project." The eligible costs associated with the

acquisition, construction, improvement, expansion, extension,
 repair, rehabilitation or security measures of all or part of
 any facility or system, whether publicly or privately owned:

4 (1) for the collection, treatment or disposal of
5 wastewater, including industrial waste;

6 (2) for the supply, treatment, storage or distribution
7 of drinking water;

8 (3) for the control of pollution associated with storm 9 water, which may include, but need not be limited to, the 10 transport, storage and the infiltration of storm water; or

11 (4) for the best management practices to address 12 pollution, including innovative techniques developed to 13 comply with the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394), 14 known as The Clean Streams Law, or identified in the county-15 prepared watershed plans pursuant to the act of October 4, 16 1978 (P.L.864, No.167), known as the Storm Water Management 17 Act[, or as identified in Pennsylvania's Nonpoint Source 18 Management Program Update, as required under section 319(b) 19 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (62 Stat. 1155, 33 20 U.S.C. § 1329(b))].

[(b.2) Nonpoint source management program projects.--A project that is consistent with Pennsylvania's Nonpoint Source Management Program Update, as required under section 319(b) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (62 Stat. 1155, 33 U.S.C. § 1329(b)), that has a water quality benefit as
