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AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 7 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," providing for administration of Pennsylvania 21 Statewide Radio Network by Pennsylvania State Police. 22 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 26 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an 27 article to read:

ARTICLE VII-A

1 PENNSYLVANIA STATEWIDE RADIO NETWORK

- 2 <u>Section 701-A.</u> Definitions.
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 4 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 6 "Business partner." An organization that has entered into an
- 7 agreement with the Commonwealth under which it offers some form
- 8 of nonmonetary consideration, such as frequency licenses or
- 9 <u>sites for system infrastructure</u>, in return for permission to use
- 10 PA-STARNet for radio communications.
- 11 "Commissioner." The Commissioner of Pennsylvania State
- 12 Police.
- 13 "Committee." The PA-STARNet Committee established under
- 14 section 703-A.
- "Emergency communications." The means and methods for
- 16 exchanging communications and information necessary for
- 17 successful incident management.
- 18 "First responder." An individual who in the early stages of
- 19 an incident is responsible for the protection and preservation
- 20 of life, property, evidence and the environment, including
- 21 emergency response providers as that term is defined in section
- 22 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107-296, 116
- 23 Stat. 2135).
- 24 "Participating agency." A government agency, public safety
- 25 organization, first responder organization, business partner or
- 26 other organization.
- 27 <u>"Pennsylvania Statewide Radio Network" or "PA-STARNet." A</u>
- 28 Statewide radio network comprising a communication and
- 29 <u>information infrastructure connected by a digital microwave</u>
- 30 system for transmission of voice and data, including all

- 1 frequency bands and other system extensions owned and operated
- 2 by the Commonwealth and connected to the core digital trunked
- 3 radio network operating in the 800 megahertz (MHz) public safety
- 4 <u>frequency band and in other public safety frequency bands</u>
- 5 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), or to
- 6 the microwave backbone network.
- 7 "Public safety communications." The means and methods for
- 8 transmitting and receiving information necessary for the conduct
- 9 of services rendered by or through Federal, State or local
- 10 government entities in support of the protection and
- 11 preservation of life, property and natural resources, as
- 12 prescribed by law.
- 13 <u>"State police." The Pennsylvania State Police.</u>
- 14 Section 702-A. Administration of PA-STARNet.
- 15 <u>(a) Authority.--The State police, through a PA-STARNet</u>
- 16 division, shall develop, operate, regulate, manage, maintain and
- 17 monitor PA-STARNet, including PA-STARNet infrastructure,
- 18 equipment, software, services and licenses.
- 19 (b) Purposes. -- The State police shall administer PA-STARNet
- 20 <u>for:</u>
- 21 (1) the benefit of the participating agencies;
- 22 (2) the support of effective communications at critical
- 23 public events; and
- 24 (3) the interoperable communication needs of Federal,
- 25 <u>State and local first responders during emergencies.</u>
- 26 (c) Policies and procedures. -- The State police shall
- 27 establish policies and procedures for the specification,
- 28 procurement, development, testing, configuration, operations,
- 29 <u>use</u>, replacement and maintenance of PA-STARNet resources.
- 30 Section 703-A. PA-STARNet Committee.

- 1 The PA-STARNet Committee is established in the State police
- 2 to provide a standing forum for participating agencies to ensure
- 3 coordination and cooperation among participating State agencies
- 4 and county and local agencies in the development and use of PA-
- 5 STARNet and its application to public safety communications and
- 6 <u>emergency communications.</u>
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
