A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to 1 conduct a study and issue a report, by December 31, 2019, on 2 the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's highway 3 maintenance funding. 5 WHEREAS, Reliable and sustainable transportation funding remains a critical issue in this Commonwealth; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Investments in State road and bridge construction contracts, public transportation capital projects, local road 8 and bridge assistance, certain turnpike expansion projects, 10 multi-modal capital projects and the condition of dirt, gravel or low-volume roads are critical to highway safety, mobility and 11 12 economic development; and 13 WHEREAS, Under 75 Pa.C.S. Ch.91, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) provides maintenance to highways 14
- 17 WHEREAS, In 2002, the Legislative Budget and Finance

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and

18 Committee (LBFC) conducted a performance audit of PennDOT, a

using a funding formula that has not been updated since 1997;

- 1 portion of which assessed the 1997 changes; and
- 2 WHEREAS, At the time, LBFC found the new formula resulted in
- 3 a fairer allocation of maintenance money; and
- 4 WHEREAS, A contemporary review comparing the conditions from
- 5 1997 to present and projections for the foreseeable future is
- 6 both appropriate and vital as a valuable tool to assess our
- 7 State highway maintenance funding program; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The study should consist of the following:
- 9 (1) A review of the funding formula for each of
- 10 PennDOT's county maintenance offices (CMOs), including
- 11 maintenance needs versus maintenance allocation.
- 12 (2) An analysis of the data under paragraph (1) to
- determine whether CMOs may have been overfunded or
- 14 underfunded.
- 15 (3) A comparison by CMOs of the condition of highways,
- 16 bridges and other major assets to ascertain efficacy of
- 17 management, funding provided, and results achieved.
- 18 (4) PennDOT's lane miles and bridges in each CMO,
- including the number and percentage that are three-digit and
- 20 four-digit highways.
- 21 (5) Vehicle miles traveled in each CMO. This includes
- larger truck vehicle miles, the percentage of vehicle miles
- that is from residents versus out-of-State vehicles and
- vehicle miles on bonded roads.
- 25 (6) State emergency funding totals by CMOs for acts of
- 26 nature, such as flooding and landslides.
- 27 (7) A comparison among the 12 PennDOT districts on the
- effects of winter maintenance, such as freeze/thaw cycles,
- 29 snowfall averages and number, type and duration of winter
- 30 events.

- 1 (8) The percentage of State highway maintenance funding
- 2 that goes toward major, fixed expenditures, including
- 3 personnel salary and benefit costs in each CMO.
- 4 (9) A review of PennDOT's Road Maintenance and
- 5 Preservation (Road MaP) program created in 2016, including
- 6 projects completed and selection criteria for these projects
- 7 and future fiscal stability of the program.
- 8 (10) County populations from 1997 to the present and
- 9 projections for the foreseeable future;
- 10 therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and
- 12 Finance Committee to conduct a study and issue a report, by
- 13 December 31, 2019, on the Pennsylvania Department of
- 14 Transportation's highway maintenance funding.
