A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of September 25 through 29, 2023, as "Safe2Say Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Act 44 of 2018 established the Safe2Say Program in
4	Pennsylvania; and
5	WHEREAS, The Safe2Say Program was created to be an anonymous
6	resource for students, school employees and community members to
7	report behavior perceived to be threatening to an individual or
8	school entity; and
9	WHEREAS, The Office of Attorney General partners with Sandy
10	Hook Promise to administer the Safe2Say Program; and
11	WHEREAS, The Office of Attorney General and Sandy Hook
12	Promise train individuals to do all of the following:
13	(1) recognize warning signs and signals from individuals
14	who may be a threat to themselves or others; and
15	(2) report concerns about individuals who may be a
16	threat to themselves or others through the Safe2Say Program;

1 WHEREAS, On January 14, 2019, the Safe2Say Program began 2 accepting reports and continues to accept reports 24 hours per 3 day, seven days per week and 365 days per year; and 4 WHEREAS, In the 2022-2023 school year, the Office of Attorney General and Sandy Hook Promise have trained approximately 5 440,000 students on the Safe2Say Program; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The Office of Attorney General's annual report on the Safe2Say Program was released in August 2023; and 8 9 WHEREAS, The report stated that since the Safe2Say Program 10 began accepting reports in January 2019, more than 113,000 reports have been submitted, with 31,027 received in the 2022-11 12 2023 school year; and 13 WHEREAS, While initially intended to prevent threats against

14 schools in this Commonwealth, the Safe2Say Program has 15 highlighted a variety of behavior and mental health concerns in 16 students; and

WHEREAS, Bullying, cyberbullying, smoking in school and suicide or suicidal ideation were the top event types reported through the Safe2Say Program in the 2022-2023 school year; and WHEREAS, The Safe2Say Program is considered a national model to protect students, teachers, school employees and the community; and

23 WHEREAS, Data shows the continued success of the program as 24 established by Act 44 of 2018; and

25 WHEREAS, The May 2023 report from the United States 26 Department of Homeland Security, United States Secret Service 27 Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency on improving 28 school safety through bystander reporting noted that 29 Pennsylvania's Safe2Say Program receives more reports per school 30 year than every other state with a similar program; therefore be
