A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of October 2023 as "Italian-American Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Explorer Christopher Columbus, the son of a wool
- 4 merchant, was born in Genoa, Italy, around 1451; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Christopher Columbus was determined to find a
- 6 quicker route west from Europe to Asia and embarked on what
- 7 would become four voyages across the Atlantic Ocean starting in
- 8 1492; and
- 9 WHEREAS, During his initial voyage, Christopher Columbus
- 10 landed upon an island in the Bahamas, and his journey became a
- 11 catalyst for centuries of exploration of the Americas; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Columbus set into motion the widespread transfer of
- 13 people, plants, animals and cultures between the Old and New
- 14 Worlds; and
- 15 WHEREAS, While Italian adventurers have always been a part of
- 16 American history, it was not until the 1820s that Italian
- 17 immigrants began moving to the United States in sizable numbers;

- 2 WHEREAS, A feudal society, high unemployment and oppressive
- 3 taxes coupled with natural disasters, disease, poverty and
- 4 famine, gave many reasons for Italians to look for freedom and
- 5 opportunities abroad; and
- 6 WHEREAS, While educated Italian professionals also emigrated,
- 7 many Italian immigrants arrived relatively unskilled, but soon
- 8 helped fuel a booming industrial economy by providing labor for
- 9 American factories and mines and helping to build roads, dams,
- 10 tunnels and other infrastructure; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As Italian Americans began settling in the country's
- 12 major cities, they faced religious and ethnic discrimination
- 13 which occasionally led to brutal violence; and
- 14 WHEREAS, For this reason, Italian Americans started
- 15 celebrating the life and accomplishments of Christopher Columbus
- 16 as a way for residents of Italian descent to be accepted by
- 17 their new homeland; and
- WHEREAS, In 1937, President Franklin D. Roosevelt proclaimed
- 19 Columbus Day as a national holiday; and
- 20 WHEREAS, We credit Christopher Columbus with Italian
- 21 immigration to the New World and what is now Pennsylvania; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Currently, there are more than 16 million Americans
- 23 of Italian heritage in the United States and more than 1.4
- 24 million Americans of Italian heritage residing in Pennsylvania;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, In 1905, the Order Sons of Italy in America was
- 27 formed, with the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania to follow in 1913;
- 28 and
- 29 WHEREAS, Their successors, the State Lodge of Pennsylvania,
- 30 Order Sons and Daughters of Italy in America and the Grand Lodge

- 1 of Pennsylvania Sons and Daughters of Italy, continue to
- 2 preserve Italian-American traditions, history and culture and
- 3 combat discrimination while upholding the positive image of
- 4 Italian heritage; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of October 2023
- 6 as "Italian-American Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania and
- 7 acknowledge the important role of early immigrants in our
- 8 Commonwealth's history.
