A RESOLUTION

Condemning the use of performance-enhancing drugs by athletes, rebuking any organization that knowingly allows or encourages 2 athletes to use performance-enhancing drugs and urging all 3 high school and college coaches and athletic directors in 4 this Commonwealth to educate themselves and their athletes 5 about the dangers of performance-enhancing drugs. 7 WHEREAS, Use of performance-enhancing drugs, commonly referred to as doping, is rampant among some professional athletes, especially those participating in strongman 10 competitions, such as World's Strongest Man owned by IMG, Arnold 11 Sports Festival, Arnold Classic, Arnold Fitness EXPO, Arnold Strongman Classic, America's Strongest Man, Arnold Amateur 12 13 Strongman World Championships, and other similar events sponsored by North American Strongman, United States Strongman, 14 15 International Powerlifting Association, Starting Strongman, Westside Barbell, Joe Weider Enterprise, International 16 17 Federation of Bodybuilding and Fitness, American Strongman 18 Corporation, Strongman Corporation, Olympia Strongman Challenge, Strongman Champions League, National Physique Committee, World 19 Wrestling Entertainment, Giants Live, Official Strongman, Roque 20

- 1 Fitness and the Xtreme Powerlifting Coalition; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The use of performance-enhancing drugs, including
- 3 anabolic steroids, androstenedione, human growth hormone,
- 4 erythropoietin, diuretics and stimulants, poses serious health
- 5 risks, such as the increased chance of suffering a heart attack
- 6 or stroke, developing liver and other cancers and triggering
- 7 mood and hormonal imbalances; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Knowingly allowing or encouraging athletes to use
- 9 performance-enhancing drugs jeopardizes their lives and the
- 10 lives of young aspiring athletes who may be unaware of the risks
- 11 of using performance-enhancing drugs and oftentimes are
- 12 influenced by the conduct of the athletes they hope to emulate;

- 14 WHEREAS, According to a study conducted by the Digital
- 15 Citizens Alliance, a consumer group working to make the Internet
- 16 safer, 77% of young males, 14 to 25 years of age, said that
- 17 steroid use by professional athletes gave young athletes the
- 18 impression that taking performance-enhancing drugs was necessary
- 19 to succeed in professional sports or improve their game;
- 20 therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Senate condemn the use of performance-
- 22 enhancing drugs by athletes and rebuke any organization that
- 23 knowingly allows or encourages athletes to use performance-
- 24 enhancing drugs; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Department of Education to
- 26 notify all public and private schools in this Commonwealth of
- 27 the adoption of this resolution and urge all high school and
- 28 college coaches and athletic directors in this Commonwealth to
- 29 educate themselves and their athletes about the dangers of
- 30 performance-enhancing drugs.
