A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Establishing a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative 1 commission to recommend safety, oversight and interagency 2 coordination improvements for the transport of oil, natural 3 gas and other hazardous liquids through pipelines in this Commonwealth and develop and promote legislation in furtherance of the commission's recommendations. 6 7 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth have a right to 8 safe communities and benefit from regulations and laws which are established to enhance their safety and protect the environment; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, Natural gas and oil extraction have increased 12 dramatically over the last decade in this Commonwealth, 13 resulting in the construction of new pipeline infrastructure to transport hazardous liquids, gases and byproducts in large 14 15 quantities through the most sensitive areas of this 16 Commonwealth; and 17 WHEREAS, While the construction and operation of any pipeline 18 carries some measure of risk, the public safety and 19 environmental risks associated with the construction and

- 1 transport of volatile chemicals are compounded dramatically when
- 2 high-volume pipelines operating under high pressure are situated
- 3 in close proximity to homes, schools and population centers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The construction of pipelines throughout this
- 5 Commonwealth has resulted in hundreds of environmental and
- 6 safety violations that have negatively impacted the residents of
- 7 this Commonwealth, resulting in the contamination of private
- 8 wells and public waterways and demonstrating the need for
- 9 exploring measures that will result in improved management,
- 10 increased safety and more comprehensive oversight of pipeline
- 11 construction and operation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In addition to the disposition provided by the
- 13 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, it is imperative that
- 14 consumer complaints are reviewed and rectified in an efficient
- 15 manner; therefore be it
- RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 17 General Assembly establish a special bipartisan, bicameral
- 18 legislative commission to recommend improvements to the process
- 19 of regulating pipeline construction and operation in this
- 20 Commonwealth and develop and promote legislation in furtherance
- 21 of the commission's recommendations; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the commission consist of the following
- 23 members:
- 24 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 25 Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of
- the Senate or designees.
- 27 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 28 Consumer Affairs Committee and the Professional Licensure
- 29 Committee of the House of Representatives or designees.
- 30 (3) The Chief Counsel of the Law Bureau of the

- 1 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission or a designee.
- 2 (4) The Director of the Bureau of Investigation and
- 3 Enforcement of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission or
- 4 a designee.
- 5 (5) The Director of the Environmental Emergency Response
- 6 Program of the Department of Environmental Protection or a
- 7 designee.
- 8 (6) The Deputy Secretary for Oil and Gas Management of
- 9 the Department of Environmental Protection or a designee.
- 10 (7) The president of the Marcellus Shale Coalition or a
- 11 designee.
- 12 (8) The executive director of the Pipeline Safety
- 13 Coalition or a designee.
- 14 (9) The president of the Pennsylvania Municipal League
- or a designee.
- 16 (10) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association
- of Boroughs or a designee.
- 18 (11) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association
- of Township Commissioners or a designee.
- 20 (12) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association
- of Township Supervisors or a designee.
- 22 (13) The president of the Pennsylvania Association of
- 23 Hazardous Materials Technicians or a designee.
- 24 (14) Two fire chiefs of volunteer fire companies in this
- Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President
- 26 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected
- 27 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 28 (15) Two fire chiefs of municipal fire companies in this
- 29 Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President
- 30 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected

- 1 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 2 (16) Four fire or emergency medical services members at-
- 3 large, two of whom shall be selected by the President pro
- 4 tempore of the Senate and two of whom shall be selected by
- 5 the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 6 (17) The Director of the Pennsylvania Emergency
- 7 Management Agency or a designee.
- 8 (18) The State Fire Commissioner or a designee.
- 9 (19) The Executive Director of the County Commissioners
- 10 Association of Pennsylvania or a designee.
- 11 (20) The President of the Pennsylvania Independent Oil
- 12 and Gas Association or a designee;
- 13 and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the commission elect a chair from its
- 15 membership; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the commission shall develop and recommend
- 17 legislation to improve the safety, oversight and interagency
- 18 coordination for pipelines in this Commonwealth; and be it
- 19 further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the commission may utilize the annual reports
- 21 regarding informal consumer complaints produced by the
- 22 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission under 66 Pa.C.S. § 308.1
- 23 (relating to consumer protection and information) in developing
- 24 the legislation; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the commission may hold hearings and take
- 26 testimony at such places as the commission deems necessary in
- 27 this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 29 provide staff support to the commission and assist with the
- 30 final report; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the commission make a final report of all
- 2 legislative recommendations by July 1, 2020, which shall be
- 3 submitted to the chairperson of the Consumer Protection and
- 4 Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate and the
- 5 chairpersons of the Consumer Affairs Committee and the
- 6 Professional Licensure Committee of the House of
- 7 Representatives; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the members of the commission shall serve
- 9 without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all necessary
- 10 and reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 11 duties; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That reasonable expenses incurred by the commission
- 13 be equally divided between the Senate and the House of
- 14 Representatives; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the approval of the chairperson and minority
- 16 chairperson of the Consumer Protection Committee of the Senate
- 17 and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Consumer
- 18 Affairs Committee and the Professional Licensure Committee of
- 19 the House of Representatives, by action of a majority of members
- 20 of the committees, shall be required to preauthorize all
- 21 proposed actions of the commission that will entail the
- 22 expenditure of State funds and shall also be required to approve
- 23 all expenditures, including expense reimbursement requests of
- 24 commission members, prior to payment.
