A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2018 as "Military Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Current studies confirm a high suicide rate among
- 4 veterans; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Though veterans make up less than 9% of the United
- 6 States population, veterans accounted for 14.3% of all suicides
- 7 in America in 2015; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In 2015, an average of 20.6 veterans lost their
- 9 lives as a result of suicide each day; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Roughly 59% of all veteran suicides in 2015 were
- 11 individuals 55 years of age or older; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Among male veterans, the largest number of lives
- 13 lost to suicide occurs in middle-aged males 55 to 74 years of
- 14 age, while the highest rates of civilian suicide are among the
- 15 youngest males 18 to 34 years of age; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In 2015, the rate of suicide among veteran males was
- 17 31.1 per 100,000, and from 2005 to 2015, the rate of suicide

- 1 among veteran males increased by 6.2%; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Among female veterans, the highest rate of suicide
- 3 occurs among the youngest female veterans 18 to 29 years of age;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2015, the rate of suicide among veteran females
- 6 was 15.3 per 100,000, and from 2005 to 2015, the rate of suicide
- 7 among veteran females increased by 5.2%; and
- 8 WHEREAS, After adjusting for differences in age and gender,
- 9 risk for suicide was 17.1% higher among veterans when compared
- 10 with civilian adults; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Officials at the Department of Veterans Affairs have
- 12 responded to the veteran suicide crisis by boosting the
- 13 department's mental health personnel and suicide hotline staff
- 14 in recent years; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Each Veterans' Administration facility has been
- 16 asked to commit to "Be There" for veterans through a number of
- 17 enhanced methods, including a "no wrong door" philosophy for
- 18 suicide prevention to ensure that every Veterans' Administration
- 19 employee assists veterans in need and to establish buddy systems
- 20 so veterans have someone to reach out to when needed; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Communities, peers, close associates and the media
- 22 are critical in preventing death by suicide; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 24 2018 as "Military Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month" in
- 25 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge civilians to help prevent
- 27 veteran suicide by learning about the warning signs of
- 28 depression and crisis; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the residents of this
- 30 Commonwealth to "Be There" for our veterans and learn about ways

- 1 to support veterans in need; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate fully support the bipartisan
- 3 actions of the Congress of the United States and the Department
- 4 of Veterans Affairs as they continue to work together to improve
- 5 the needed support for our veterans; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 7 the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs in support of
- 8 the department's continued efforts to prevent military suicides.
