A RESOLUTION

Recognizing February 12, 2017, as "Drugs Kill Dreams, Opioid 1 Alert Day" in Pennsylvania to raise the level of prevention 2 and awareness regarding opioids and to encourage full 3 participation in education, prevention, treatment, recovery 5 and law enforcement throughout the year. 6 WHEREAS, Research shows that a proactive approach works to 7 reduce substance abuse among young adults if they are part of a community-based prevention effort while still in elementary and 8 middle school; and 9 10 WHEREAS, A drug prevention program was established in 1994 by 11 Armstrong County Magisterial District Judge, J. Gary DeComo, and 12 was later renamed "Drugs Kill Dreams" in 2000; and WHEREAS, The mission of the "Drugs Kill Dreams" program is to 13 14 increase drug and alcohol prevention awareness in schools and 15 communities throughout western Pennsylvania, adhering to a 16 strong belief that if prevention is increased, addiction and 17 crimes committed by individuals with addictions will decrease; 18 and

WHEREAS, "Drugs Kill Dreams, Opioid Alert Day" joins with

- 2 Drugs, " "Guiding Good Choices" and "PROSPER" that partner with
- 3 schools, churches and other community organizations to share
- 4 education materials and prevention messages, with the goal of
- 5 stopping drug and alcohol addiction and abuse before it begins
- 6 and encouraging youngsters to live healthy, respectful and

- 8 WHEREAS, Opioid abuse has reached epidemic proportions so all
- 9 Pennsylvanians need to be educated to prevent addiction;
