A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of November 2018 as "Epilepsy Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Epilepsy is a neurological condition sometimes
4	referred to as a seizure disorder; and
5	WHEREAS, Epilepsy is a widely misunderstood medical
6	condition; and
7	WHEREAS, As the fourth most common neurological disorder in
8	the United States following migraines, stroke and Alzheimer's
9	disease, epilepsy affects 5 million Americans of all ages; and
10	WHEREAS, Approximately 200,000 new cases of epilepsy occur
11	each year, most often in young children or senior citizens; and
12	WHEREAS, One in 26 people will develop epilepsy in that
13	person's lifetime; and
14	WHEREAS, Up to 50,000 Americans die each year from seizures
15	and related causes, including sudden unexplained death in
16	epilepsy; and
17	WHEREAS, One in three people with epilepsy endure

1 uncontrollable seizures because no available treatment is

2 effective; and

3 WHEREAS, Epilepsy is characterized by recurring seizures that 4 are physical reactions to sudden, brief, excessive electrical 5 discharges in brain cells; and

6 WHEREAS, These excessive electrical discharges impact the 7 brain, causing seizure disorders; and

8 WHEREAS, Seizures, often thought to be full-body convulsions, 9 can be brief muscle spasms or unconscious behaviors that appear 10 to be attention lapses; and

11 WHEREAS, Increasing awareness of epilepsy eases fears of the 12 condition and improves the lives of the millions of affected 13 individuals and those who care for them; and

14 WHEREAS, Joining in this effort will not only raise awareness 15 but will educate people about epilepsy and encourage the support 16 of epilepsy research programs that can lead to a better quality 17 of life for those individuals with epilepsy; therefore be it 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of November 19 2018 as "Epilepsy Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.

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
