## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2023 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, April is nationally recognized as "Sexual Assault
- 4 Awareness Month" to call attention to the fact that sexual
- 5 violence is widespread and impacts every community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, April 2023 marks the 22nd anniversary of the
- 7 designation of "Sexual Assault Awareness Month"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Rape, sexual assault and sexual harassment have a
- 9 deep physical and emotional trauma on those who have experienced
- 10 it; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Rape in the United States occurs more frequently
- 12 than the public realizes, as 1 in 5 women and 1 in 67 men have
- 13 been raped in the United States; and
- 14 WHEREAS, On postsecondary campuses, 1 in 5 women and 1 in 16
- 15 men are sexually assaulted at some point in their educational
- 16 career; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Young people experience heightened rates of child

- 1 sexual abuse as one in six boys and one in four girls experience
- 2 sexual assault before 18 years of age; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Lesbian and bisexual women may be up to three times
- 4 as likely as heterosexual women to report having been sexually
- 5 assaulted during their lifetime; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Gay men may be up to 15 times as likely as
- 7 heterosexual men to report having been sexually assaulted during
- 8 their lifetime; and
- 9 WHEREAS, More than 90% of individuals with a developmental
- 10 delay or disability will be sexually assaulted at least once in
- 11 their lifetime; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Twenty-seven percent of all sexual assault
- 13 victimizations for adults and children end in arrest; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Communities can support survivors by believing their
- 15 stories, showing respect and championing their individual
- 16 support networks; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Individuals speaking out against inappropriate
- 18 jokes, offensive gestures, harmful attitudes and unwanted
- 19 actions make a positive impact toward ending sexual harassment,
- 20 abuse and assault; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Consent and boundaries can be violated online in a
- 22 number of ways; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Individuals can work together to make their
- 24 communities safer by providing prevention education and
- 25 increasing public awareness to avoid future harm from sexual
- 26 violence; therefore be it
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2023
- 28 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 29 further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the 22nd anniversary of

- 1 "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" to empower more survivors and
- 2 their loved ones on their journey to help, hope and heal; and be
- 3 it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage communities to understand
- 5 their role in ending sexual violence in Pennsylvania and the
- 6 United States; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage communities to commit to
- 8 make a difference to ensure that online platforms are safe and
- 9 respectful for everyone by practicing consent, keeping kids safe
- 10 and supporting survivors.
