## A RESOLUTION

| 3      | WHEREAS, Distracted driving is any activity that could divert                                   |
| 4      | a driver's attention away from the primary task of driving; and                                 |
| 5      | WHEREAS, Texting is the most alarming distraction while   |
| 6      | driving because it involves manual, visual and cognitive  |
| 7      | distraction simultaneously; and   |
| 8      | WHEREAS, Distraction latency lasts an average of 27 seconds,                                    |
| 9      | resulting in a driver not being fully engaged in the primary                                    |
| 10     | task of driving even after having put down an interactive                                       |
| 11     | wireless communication device; and  |
| 12     | WHEREAS, A recent nationwide survey suggests that more than                                     |
| 13     | 60% of drivers reported using their interactive wireless  |
| 14     | communication device while driving; and   |
| 15     | WHEREAS, Distracted driving is not confined to a single   |
| 16     | cause, age group, level of education or driver demographic; and                                 |
| 17     | WHEREAS, In 2017, there were more than 15,600 crashes   |

1 involving a distracted driver in this Commonwealth; and

2 WHEREAS, From 2013 through 2017, there were 317 fatalities in 3 crashes involving a distracted driver, or an average of 63 4 fatalities per year, in this Commonwealth; and

5 WHEREAS, Even though this Commonwealth has a primary offense 6 anti-texting law, which prohibits drivers from sending, reading 7 or writing a text-based communication via an interactive 8 wireless communication device while the vehicle is in motion, 9 additional legislative action and enforcement can help mitigate 10 and reduce crashes and fatal crashes involving distracted 11 driving; and

12 WHEREAS, The best way to end distracted driving is for 13 drivers to put down their interactive wireless communication 14 device and educate all residents of this Commonwealth about the 15 danger distracted driving poses; therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2019 17 as "Distracted Driving Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be 18 it further

19 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all drivers in this 20 Commonwealth to consider the lives of others on the road and 21 avoid distracted driving.
