A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2019 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Widespread public awareness is the first step in
- 4 addressing sexual assault and its prevention; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the National Sexual Violence Resource
- 6 Center, one in five women and one in seventy-one men will be
- 7 raped at some point in their lives; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Of those, nearly 80% of women were raped before 25
- 9 years of age, with 40% experiencing their first rape between the
- 10 ages of 11 and 17, and 28% of men were first raped before their
- 11 10th birthday; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Forty-four percent of women and 23% of men
- 13 experienced other forms of sexual violence during their lives,
- 14 including sexual coercion, unwanted sexual contact and other
- 15 noncontact sexual experiences; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Most victims of sexual assault are acquainted with
- 17 their assailants; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Young people experience heightened rates of sexual
- 2 violence; and
- 3 WHEREAS, One in four girls and one in six boys will be
- 4 sexually abused before reaching 18 years of age; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Being the victim of child sexual abuse doubles the
- 6 likelihood of adult sexual victimization; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Sexual assault is a significant problem; and
- 8 WHEREAS, One in five women and one in sixteen men are
- 9 sexually assaulted during their time in college; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Sexual assault can have lasting, harmful effects on
- 11 survivors and their loved ones in our communities; and
- 12 WHEREAS, To preserve the safety and welfare of our fellow
- 13 citizens, we must confront harmful attitudes and actions; and
- 14 WHEREAS, To help the individual and social progress of our
- 15 fellow citizens, we must support survivors of sexual assault in
- 16 times of crisis and throughout their recovery; and
- 17 WHEREAS, To generate a comprehensive response to sexual
- 18 violence, we must highlight sexual assault prevention
- 19 initiatives, bolster criminal justice programs and commit to
- 20 breaking cycles of violence and reducing crime rates in our
- 21 communities; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape (PCAR) and a
- 23 network of 50 rape crisis centers partner with community members
- 24 to prevent sexual violence throughout this Commonwealth; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Funded by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 26 Prevention to operate the National Sexual Violence Resource
- 27 Center, PCAR develops and provides evidence-based prevention
- 28 programs, based on the principles of effective prevention; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The strategies are critical to the health of our
- 30 major social systems, such as schools, child care agencies,

- 1 workplaces, athletics, health care, legal systems and others to
- 2 move upstream and stop sexual violence before it occurs; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The 2019 Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign is
- 4 focusing on resources related to consent; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The campaign theme for 2019, "I Ask," champions the
- 6 message that asking for consent is a healthy, normal and
- 7 necessary part of everyday interactions; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2019
- 9 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
