A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Designating April 10, 2019, as "Stronger Than Hate Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, On October 27, 2018, tragedy struck Pittsburgh's
- 4 Squirrel Hill neighborhood, which is home to a vibrant, diverse
- 5 and loving Jewish community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Several different Jewish houses of worship,
- 7 including Orthodox, Reconstructionist, Conservative and Reform
- 8 have long been a part of the fabric of that community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Tree of Life synagogue building is home to three
- 10 congregations, Tree of Life*Or L'Simcha, New Light and Dor
- 11 Hadash, each with its own distinct voice and faithful community
- 12 of thinkers and worshipers; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The coexistence of disparate congregations in the
- 14 Tree of Life building offered a spiritual place for a diverse
- 15 population of Jews living in Squirrel Hill and Pittsburgh; and
- 16 WHEREAS, With the exception of New York City, Pittsburgh is

- 1 the last Jewish community in the United States in which the
- 2 majority of its members still reside within the city, largely
- 3 because of the still-flourishing cultural and religious life of
- 4 the Squirrel Hill neighborhood; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As the popularity of the Squirrel Hill neighborhood
- 6 has grown, it has become a community that enjoys ethnic and
- 7 religious diversity, both holding onto its Jewish identity and
- 8 history and celebrating the gifts that new populations bring;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, While the General Assembly must remember in sorrow
- 11 the tragedy of the loss of 11 souls, we should also celebrate
- 12 their lives, their contributions to their community and the
- 13 family and friends who loved them; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Joyce Fienberg, who was a retired researcher at the
- 15 University of Pittsburgh and a community volunteer, was known
- 16 for her willingness to pitch in and help anywhere that she saw a
- 17 need; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Dr. Richard Gottfried was known for providing free
- 19 dental care to refugees and immigrants, his love of golf,
- 20 reading, running and fine wine; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Rose Mallinger, known as "Bubbie" by all of her
- 22 relatives, who worshiped at the Tree of Life Synagogue for more
- 23 than 60 years, was 97 years old and amazed all who encountered
- 24 her with her energy; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Dr. Jerry Rabinowitz was known for his bowties, his
- 26 laugh and for being a skilled and compassionate doctor whose
- 27 practice was a safe place for HIV patients in the early years of
- 28 the disease; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Cecil Rosenthal, described as the "honorary mayor of
- 30 Squirrel Hill," was known for his concern for others and his

- 1 love of swimming; and
- 2 WHEREAS, David Rosenthal was known for his strong work ethic
- 3 and his love of anything related to the police or fire
- 4 department, and while the Rosenthal brothers lived with
- 5 intellectual disabilities, that did not stop them from having
- 6 rich, full lives that brought joy to all who encountered them;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Bernice Simon, a former nurse, died along side the
- 9 love of her life, husband, Sylvan Simon, a veteran and a retired
- 10 accountant, and the two of them were known for their sweet,
- 11 funny banter with one another and their love of the symphony;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Dan Stein, who was a salesman for a plumbing supply
- 14 company, a driver for a funeral home and a former substitute
- 15 teacher, was known for being quick to help others, unpretentious
- 16 and a great fundraiser for his congregation; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Melvin "Mel" Wax was an accountant who, after
- 18 retirement, made use of his unique abilities with numbers to
- 19 track Pittsburgh Pirates statistics and was known for his quick,
- 20 silly humor and his commitment to attending services every
- 21 single week; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Irving "Irv" Younger, who owned a realty company and
- 23 was a former high school baseball coach, was known for his
- 24 delight at becoming a grandfather and his willingness to help a
- 25 stranger; and
- 26 WHEREAS, On the morning of October 27, 2018, the victims
- 27 mentioned above and their fellow worshipers were beginning
- 28 services or setting up for their activities at the Tree of
- 29 Life*Or L'Simcha synagogue building; and
- 30 WHEREAS, A gunman entered these congregations and killed 11

- 1 citizens of this Commonwealth in the largest deadly act of anti-
- 2 Semitism in United States history; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Daniel Leger and Andrea Wedner each suffered gunshot
- 4 wounds and survived; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Due to the courageous response by law enforcement,
- 6 first responders and local medical professionals, lives were
- 7 saved; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Officers Daniel Mead, Michael Smidga, Anthony Burke,
- 9 Timothy Matson, John Persin and Tyler Pashel were injured as
- 10 they attempted to stop the shooter; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Jewish Community Center immediately made itself
- 12 the central contact point for families of victims and others
- 13 affected by the attack, creating a comfortable place for
- 14 devastated community members to access information and services
- 15 amidst the confusion; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Jewish Family and Community Services marshalled
- 17 mental health resources to provide the entire community with
- 18 counseling services, making therapists available for individuals
- 19 and dispatching mental health professionals to schools, medical
- 20 facilities, senior centers and more; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Just hours after the attack, thousands of
- 22 Pennsylvanians converged on the streets of Squirrel Hill and
- 23 individuals and groups across the world responded to this
- 24 tragedy to pray, mourn, demonstrate and support those in need;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, The American Jewish Committee responded to the
- 27 attack by asking Jews and non-Jews to "Show up for Shabbat," and
- 28 synagogues throughout the world welcomed in strangers of all
- 29 faiths to share their heartbreak and show solidarity against
- 30 anti-Semitism; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Islamic Center of Pittsburgh, the broader Muslim
- 2 community and so many diverse communities throughout the region
- 3 reached out with compassion and wholehearted support in a way
- 4 that showed the world that acts of violence will only serve to
- 5 further unite faithful people across religions and traditions;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, In the painful aftermath of the attack, the singular
- 8 phrase that arose from the heartbroken city of Pittsburgh became
- 9 "Stronger Than Hate"; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The General Assembly thanks the first responders,
- 11 rabbis, staff, lay leadership and hundreds of members of these
- 12 synagogues who helped their family and friends; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The General Assembly thanks the doctors, nurses and
- 14 countless medical professionals who treated the injured; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The General Assembly thanks the rabbis and
- 16 volunteers of the two Chevrah Kadisha, or burial societies, that
- 17 sanctified the dead; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The General Assembly thanks the Jewish Federation of
- 19 Greater Pittsburgh, Jewish Community Center of Greater
- 20 Pittsburgh and Jewish Family and Community Services of
- 21 Pittsburgh and the countless volunteers and donors of every
- 22 faith and background in Squirrel Hill and around the world;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly designate April 10, 2019,
- 25 as "Stronger Than Hate Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly honor the 11
- 27 Pennsylvanians who lost their lives and made significant
- 28 contributions to their communities; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly recognize the wounded,
- 30 the survivors and the family and friends who have personally and

- 1 intensely felt the senseless tragedy of these few minutes of
- 2 mass violence; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly stand against the violent
- 4 hatred shown toward fellow Pennsylvanians and others on the
- 5 basis of religion or targeted at those who seek to pray
- 6 peacefully in the house of worship of their choice; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 9 the congregations of Tree of Life*Or L'Simcha, New Light and Dor
- 10 Hadash and the families of Joyce Fienberg, Dr. Richard
- 11 Gottfried, Rose Mallinger, Dr. Jerry Rabinowitz, Cecil and David
- 12 Rosenthal, Bernice and Sylvan Simon, Dan Stein, Melvin Wax and
- 13 Irving Younger.
