## SENATE RESOLUTION

# HONORING CÉSAR ESTRADA CHÁVEZ (1927-1993)

Introduced By: Senators Pichardo, Nesselbush, Tassoni, Crowley, and Pinga

Date Introduced: March 31, 2011

Referred To: Recommended for Immediate Consideration

1	WHEREAS, César Chávez, born in Yuma, Arizona, on March 31, 1927, grew up in a
2	series of migrant labor camps in Arizona and California. After serving in the Navy from 1944 to
3	1945, he returned to migrant farm work; and
4	WHEREAS, While working with the Community Service Organization (CSO) in San
5	Jose, California, César Chávez led voter registration drives, helped Chicanos with immigration
6	problems, and organized CSO chapters in other cities. In 1962, when the CSO refused to create a
7	farm workers' union, he resigned; and
8	WHEREAS, During that same year, Chávez began to organize the National Farm
9	Workers' Association and, by 1965, 1,700 families enrolled. Always practicing non-violent
10	tactics borrowed from Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, Chávez invited arrest or fasted to call
11	attention to his struggle with the growers; and
12	WHEREAS, In September 1965 Chávez's union joined migrant Filipino grape pickers on
13	a strike against the growers that lasted into the 1970s. Under his leadership, the union organized
14	boycotts of non-union farm products; and
15	WHEREAS, In 1966, the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industria
16	Organizations (AFL-CIO) chartered the United Farm Workers' Organizing Committee with
17	Chávez as president; and
18	WHEREAS, Chávez became a contemporary American hero and is an inspiration to all

who value the basic American ideals of justice, equality, and freedom; and

WHEREAS, Chávez advocated for non-violent social reform in protecting the

1	environment and the rights of the consumers.	Ultimately, he forged	l an extraordinary a	and diverse
