

2024 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1002

1An Act to require administration of the ACT to public school students in grade2eleven.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 13-3-55 be AMENDED:

5 **13-3-55.** Every public Each school district shall annually administer the same 6 assessment to all students in grades three to eight, inclusive, and in grade eleven. The 7 assessment-shall must measure the academic progress of each student.

8 Every public Each school district shall annually administer to all students in at least 9 two grade levels <u>an achievement a</u> test to assess writing skills. The <u>Department of</u> 10 Education shall provide the assessment instruments shall be provided by the Department 11 of Education, and the department shall <u>and</u> determine the two grade levels to be tested 12 at which the tests are to be administered.

13 The <u>assessment and</u> tests <u>shall must</u> be administered within timelines established 14 by the Department of Education by <u>in</u> rules, promulgated <u>by the department</u>, pursuant to 15 chapter 1-26-starting in the spring of the 2002-2003 school year. Each state-designed 16 test <u>shall must</u> be correlated with the state's content standards.

17 The South Dakota Board of Education Standards may promulgate rules, pursuant 18 to chapter 1-26, to provide for <u>the</u> administration of all <u>tests and</u> assessments <u>under this</u> 19 <u>section, and within the timelines established by the department</u>.

20 Section 2. That chapter 13-3 be amended with a NEW SECTION:

Each public school student, enrolled in grade eleven, shall, in addition to any other
assessment or test required by this chapter, take the ACT, including the writing test. Each
student's ACT registration fee must be paid by the student's school district. The
Department of Education shall, with moneys appropriated in the General Appropriations
Act, reimburse each school district for the registration fees.
