- FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to establish certain provisions regarding the opportunity
- 2 scholarship program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That chapter 13-55 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- 5 In order to be eligible for a South Dakota opportunity scholarship pursuant to this section,
- a student who received alternative instruction pursuant to §§ 13-27-2 to 13-27-9, inclusive,
- 7 shall:
- 8 (1) Be a resident of this state;
- 9 (2) Obtain a composite score of at least twenty-four on the ACT or a comparable score
- on the Scholastic Aptitude Test as determined by the Board of Regents;
- 11 (3) Provide a transcript of completed coursework that is issued by the parent or guardian

24	or technical school, the student is eligible to receive a partial award.				

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1 A student is eligible to participate in the South Dakota opportunity scholarship program for

- 2 the equivalent of eight consecutive fall and spring semesters or until the attainment of a
- 3 baccalaureate degree, whichever comes first. The Board of Regents may grant exceptions to the
- 4 continuous enrollment requirement upon a showing of good cause.
- 5 Section 2. That chapter 13-55 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- Except as otherwise provided in this section, if a student who would otherwise have been
- 7 eligible for a South Dakota opportunity scholarship applies after completing at least one
- 8 semester of full-time work at a regionally accredited university, college, or technical school, the
- 9 student shall demonstrate compliance with the same credit hour requirements that apply to
- program participants. A scholarship provided under these circumstances is not retroactive and
- a student's eligibility is reduced by one semester for each semester of work that the student had
- 12 completed.
- Any student who would have qualified to receive a scholarship during the 2018-2019
- academic year under provisions set forth in this Act, and who did not receive a scholarship
- under §§ 13-55-31 to 13-55-35, inclusive, may in addition to any other application for a
- scholarship, submit an application for a retroactive 2018-2019 scholarship. A retroactive
- 17 2018-2019 scholarship awarded under this section shall be applied toward any expenses for
- which a scholarship awarded under §§ 13-55-31 to 13-55-35, inclusive, may be used.
- 19 Section 3. That chapter 13-55 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- The Board of Regents shall promulgate rules under chapter 1-26 to:
- 21 (1) Establish the minimum credit hours required for full-time enrollment;
- 22 (2) Establish the time and manner in which a student may request an exception to the
- continuous semester enrollment requirement;
- 24 (3) Establish the manner in which academic course and grade equivalents are determined

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1		in the case of transfer students;
2	(4)	Establish the time and manner in which applications for scholarships must be
3		submitted and reviewed;
4	(5)	Establish the time and manner in which students are to be notified of decisions
5		pertaining to the award of an opportunity scholarship; and
6	(6)	Establish the time and manner in which students may contest any decision regarding
7		the award or continuance of a scholarship.
8	No rule p	promulgated in accordance with this section may impose greater requirements or
9	conseque	nces than those imposed on students who are awarded a scholarship under §§ 13-55-31

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to 13-55-35, inclusive.
