- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to exempt law enforcement from the requirements to be
- 2 licensed as commercial drivers.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 32-12A-9 be amended to read:
- 5 32-12A-9. The following are exempt from the provisions of this chapter:
- 6 (1) Operators involved in farm to market transportation movements, at least sixteen
- years of age holding a valid operator's license, limited to those operators of a farm
 vehicle:
- 9 (a) Controlled and operated by a farmer;
- 10 (b) Used to transport either agricultural products, farm machinery, or farm 11 supplies to or from a farm; and
- 12 (c) Not used in the operations of a common or contract motor carrier;
- Operators of emergency fire fighting equipment necessary to the preservation of life
 or property or the execution of emergency governmental functions performed under
- 15 emergency conditions that are not subject to normal traffic regulation, or



1		nonemergency conditions when if operated by members of a fire fighting or law
2		enforcement agency;
3	(3)	Operators of commercial motor vehicles for military purposes including:
4		(a) Active duty military personnel;
5		(b) Members of the military reserves;
6		(c) Members of the national guard on active duty, including personnel on full-
7		time national guard duty, personnel on part-time national guard training and
8		national guard military technicians (civilians who are required to wear military
9		uniforms); and
10		(d) Active duty U.S. Coast Guard personnel;
11	(4)	Operators of recreational vehicles;
12	(5)	Operators of rental transporting equipment used as personal family use vehicles; and
13	(6)	Operators of a covered farm vehicle as defined in 49 CFR 390.5 as of January 1,
14		2015.
