- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to prohibit the use of certain photo monitoring devices to
- 2 detect red light violations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That chapter 32-28 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 5 follows:
- No state, county, municipal, or township authority may contract with any private corporation
- 7 to provide for the use of any photo monitoring device to detect any red light violation.
- 8 Section 2. That chapter 32-28 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 9 follows:
- For the purposes of this Act, the term, photo monitoring device, means a stationary,
- unmanned device used with a lighted traffic control device to detect a red light violation
- combined with a photographic identification of the vehicle which results in the issuance of a



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- 1 citation against the registrant, rather than the driver, of the vehicle.
- 2 Section 3. That chapter 32-28 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 This Act constitutes a general law of the state within the meaning of S.D. Const., Article IX,
- 5 § 2.
