- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require health care facilities that perform mammography
- 2 to inform mammography patients on breast density.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That chapter 34-12 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- 5 Any health care facility as defined in § 34-12-1.1 that performs mammography services shall
- 6 include information on breast density in the mammogram report that is required to be sent to
- 7 each mammography patient under the Federal Mammography Quality Standards Act (42 U.S.C.
- 8 Section 263b), as amended to January 1, 2019. The information shall identify the patient's
- 9 individual breast density classification as determined by the interpreting physician based on the
- breast imaging reporting and data system standards established by the American College of
- Radiology. If the interpreting physician determines that a patient has heterogeneously or



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1 extremely dense breasts, the mammogram report shall include the following notice:

2 "Your mammogram indicates that you have dense breast tissue. Dense breast tissue is 3 common and is not abnormal. It is found in more than forty percent of women. However, dense 4 breast tissue may make it harder to detect cancer on a mammogram and may also be associated 5 with an increased risk of breast cancer. This information is given to you and your health care 6 provider to raise your awareness of breast density. We encourage you to talk with your health 7 care provider about this and other breast cancer risk factors. Together, you can decide if 8 additional breast imaging would be beneficial based on your mammogram results, risk factors, 9 and physical examination."

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this section does not create a cause of action or create a standard of care, obligation, or duty beyond the duty to provide notice as set forth in this section.

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This section does not require a notice that is inconsistent with the provisions of the Federal
Mammography Quality Standards Act or any regulations adopted under the act.
