- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to establish minimum requirements for high school
- 2 graduation.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That chapter 13-1 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- 5 Except as provided in section 2 of this Act, the following constitute the minimum
- 6 requirements for high school graduation:
- 7 (1) Four units of English language arts, including:
- 8 (a) One-half unit of American literature;
- 9 (b) One unit of literature;
- 10 (c) One and one-half units of writing;
- 11 (d) One-half unit of speech or debate; and
- 12 (e) One-half unit of any English language arts elective;
- 13 (2) Three units of social studies, including:
- 14 (a) One-half unit of United States government;
- 15 (b) One unit of United States history;

1		(c) One-half unit of world history; and
2		(d) One-half unit of geography;
3	(3)	Three units of mathematics, including:
4		(a) One unit of algebra I;

8		(a) One unit of biology;
9		(b) One unit of chemistry or physics; and

4	Section 2	. That chapter 13-1 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
5	If after co	ompleting at least two years of high school a student has failed to pass at least
6	one-half unit	from any three subdivisions in section 1 of this Act or if the student has a grade
7	point average	that is at or below the twenty-fifth percentile of all students in the district who are
8	enrolled in the	e same grade, the student may request that the student's principal, and the student's
9	guidance cou	nselor or a teacher, meet with the student and the student's parent to determine if
10	the student sh	nould be permitted to pursue an optional high school curriculum, in place of the
11	requirements	set forth in section 1 of this Act.
12	If after me	eeting with school personnel as set forth in this section a student's parent consents
13	in writing to t	the student pursuing the optional high school curriculum, the student is eligible to
14	receive a higl	h school diploma upon completing the following requirements:

14	13-1-12.1. The South Dakota Board of Education Standards shall promulgate rules pursuant		
15	to chapte	r 1-26 to establish standards:	
16	<u>(1)</u>	Standards for the classification and accreditation of schools within this state, to	
17		establish standards for:	
18	<u>(2)</u>	Standards for the preparation of certified personnel, to set forth procedures;	
19	<u>(3)</u>	Procedures for determining the eligibility of school districts to receive state aid to for	
20		education funding, to adopt policies and rules necessary to establish standards;	
21	<u>(4)</u>	Standards and procedures for career and technical education, and to establish	
22		curriculum requirements for a recommended;	
23	<u>(5)</u>	Standards for the required high school program courses set forth in section 1 of this	
24		Act for all public and nonpublic schools within the in this state. The recommended	

1	high school program shall include a rigorous high school curriculum in both
2	academic and career and technical courses. The requirements of the recommended
3	program shall be aligned to the academic content standards developed pursuant to
4	§ 13-3-48 and shall, at a minimum, include the content standards tested pursuant to
5	§ 13-3-55 and for the optional program set forth in section 2 of this Act.
6	Nothing in this section authorizes the board to require the use of specifically designated

7 curriculum or methods of instruction.
