SUMMARY OF BILL: Eliminates the statute of limitation for prosecution of second degree murder for offenses committed on or after July 1, 2019.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-210, second degree murder is a Class A felony, and pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-2-101(b)(1), prosecution for a Class A felony is required to begin within 15 years of the offense.
- The proposed legislation authorizes a person to be prosecuted, tried and punished for second degree murder committed on or after July 1, 2019 at any time after the offense is committed.
- The repeal of the statute of limitations for second degree murder may lead to additional incarceration costs sometime after July 1, 2034; however the number of such additional convictions as a result of this legislation is estimated to be not significant, and thus, the fiscal impact from repealing the statute of limitation for such crimes is estimated to be not significant.
