AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 10, Chapter 7; Title 38; Title 39 and Title 40, relative to minor victims of violent crime.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 38-7-110, is amended by deleting subsection (c) and substituting:

(c)

(1) Except as provided in this subsection (c) and subsection (d), the reports of the county medical examiners, toxicological reports, and autopsy reports are public documents.

(2)

- (A) The reports of county medical examiners and autopsy reports of minors whose manner of death is listed as a homicide are not public documents.
- (B) The report of a county medical examiner or autopsy report of a minor whose manner of death is listed as a homicide may be released or inspected, as applicable, if:
 - (i) The minor's parent or legal guardian is not a suspect in the circumstances of the minor's death, and the parent or legal guardian consents to the release;
 - (ii) A court orders the release of the report upon a showing of good cause;
 - (iii) Another state or federal law requires such release; or
 - (iv) Notwithstanding § 10-7-506(a), the reports are only available for in-person inspection and no photographs, photocopies, or electronic images are taken of the reports.
- (3) Medical records of deceased persons, law enforcement investigative reports, and photographs, video, and other images of deceased persons are not public records.

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
