## AN ACT

- To ensure public access to the summit of Rattlesnake Mountain in the Hanford Reach National Monument for educational, recreational, historical, scientific, cultural, and other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Rattlesnake Mountain

- 5 Congress finds the following:
- (1) The Hanford Reach National Monument is
  public land that belongs to the American people.
- 8 (2) The United States Fish and Wildlife Serv-9 ice's Comprehensive Conservation Plan (CCP) for 10 the Monument restricts public access to large por-11 tions of the Monument, including the summit of 12 Rattlesnake Mountain.
  - (3) Public access to Rattlesnake Mountain is important for educational, recreational, historical, scientific, and cultural purposes.
  - (4) Rattlesnake Mountain reaches an elevation of 3,660 feet above sea level—the highest elevation of the Monument, and provides unparalleled scenic views over the Monument, the Hanford Site, and the Columbia River.
- 21 (5) Public access to Rattlesnake Mountain will 22 increase tourism interest in the Monument and will 23 provide economic benefits to local governments.

1	SEC. 3. ENSURING PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE SUMMIT OF
2	RATTLESNAKE MOUNTAIN IN THE HANFORD
3	REACH NATIONAL MONUMENT.
4	(a) In General.—The Secretary of the Interior shall
5	provide public access to the summit of Rattlesnake Moun-
6	tain in the Hanford Reach National Monument for edu-
7	cational, recreational, historical, scientific, cultural, and
8	other purposes, including—
9	(1) motor vehicle access; and
10	(2) pedestrian and other nonmotorized access.
11	(b) Cooperative Agreements.—The Secretary of
12	the Interior may enter into cooperative agreements to fa-
13	cilitate access to the summit of Rattlesnake Mountain—
14	(1) with the Secretary of Energy, the State of
15	Washington, or any local government agency or
16	other interested persons, for guided tours, including
17	guided motorized tours to the summit of Rattlesnake
18	Mountain; and
19	(2) with the Secretary of Energy, and with the
20	State of Washington or any local government agency

- 1 or other interested persons, to maintain the access
