A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary concerned from discouraging the inspection of military housing for lead-based paint or other sources of lead, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON DISCOURAGING LEAD IN-**
4 **SPECTIONS IN MILITARY HOUSING.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary concerned (as such
6 term is defined in section 101(a)(9) of title 10, United
7 States Code) may not discourage the inspection of covered
8 housing for lead-based paint or sources of lead.

1 (b) TESTING AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary con-
2 cerned may authorize testing for lead in covered housing
3 when such testing is not required by Federal, State or
4 local regulations or laws.

5 (c) COVERED HOUSING.—In this section, the term
6 “covered housing” means military owned and government
7 controlled family housing and privately leased or rented
8 housing.

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
