AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to continue stocking fish in certain lakes in the North Cascades National Park, Ross Lake National Recreation Area, and Lake Chelan National Recreation Area.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS; PURPOSE.
- 4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

- 1 (1) The North Cascades complex contains 245
 2 mountain lakes, of which 91 have been historically
 3 stocked with fish.
 - (2) In many cases, the stocking of fish in these lakes dates back to the 1800s.
 - (3) This practice has been important to the economy of the area because of the recreational opportunities it creates.
 - (4) During congressional hearings on the designation of the North Cascades National Park, the Department of the Interior indicated that the practice of fish stocking would be continued if the area became a unit of the National Park Service system.
 - (5) Since designation of the National Park in 1968, the stocking of certain lakes has continued under various agreements between the National Park Service and the State of Washington.
 - (6) An Environmental Impact Statement completed by the National Park Service recommends continued stocking of up to 42 of the lakes that have historically been stocked with fish.
- 22 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of this Act is to clarify
 23 the continued authority of the National Park Service to
 24 allow the stocking of fish in certain lakes in the North

7	(a) In General.—The Secretary of the Interior, act-					
8	ing through the Director of the National Park Service,					
9	shall authorize the stocking of fish in lakes in the North

12	(b) Conditions.—The following conditions shall					
13	apply to stocking of lakes under subsection (a):					
14	(1) The Secretary is authorized to allow stock-

17	(2) The Secretary shall only stock fish that

3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "North Cascades National
5	Park Service Complex Fish Stocking Act".
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
7	In this Act:
8	(1) North cascades national park service
9	COMPLEX.—The term "North Cascades National Park
10	Service Complex" means collectively the North Cas-
11	cades National Park, Ross Lake National Recreation
12	Area, and Lake Chelan National Recreation Area.
13	(2) Plan.—The term "plan" means the docu-
14	ment entitled "North Cascades National Park Service
15	Complex Mountain Lakes Fishery Management Plan
16	and Environmental Impact Statement" and dated
17	June 2008.
18	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
19	the Secretary of the Interior.
20	SEC. 3. STOCKING OF CERTAIN LAKES IN THE NORTH CAS-
21	CADES NATIONAL PARK SERVICE COMPLEX.
22	(a) In General.—Subject to subsection (b), the Sec-
23	retary shall authorize the stocking of fish in lakes in the
24	North Cascades National Park Service Complex.
25	(b) Conditions.—

1	(1) In general.—The Secretary is authorized to

11 (3) Considerations.—In making fish sto						
12	2 decisions under this Act, the Secretary shall make i					
13	3 of relevant scientific information, including the pla					
14	and information gathered under subsection (c).					
15	(4) Required coordination.—The Secretary					
16	shall coordinate the stocking of fish under this Act					
17	with the State of Washington.					
18	(c) Research and Monitoring.—The Secretary					
19	shall—					
20	(1) continue a program of research and moni-					
21	toring of the impacts of fish stocking on the resources					
22	of the applicable unit of the North Cascades National					
23	Park Service Complex; and					
24	(2) beginning on the date that is 5 years after					
25	the date of enactment of this Act and every 5 years					

thereafter, submit to the Committee on Energy and
Natural Resources of the Senate and the Committee
on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives
a report that describes the results of the research and
monitoring under paragraph (1).
