3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Travel Advisor Retail

5 Fairness Act".

6 SEC. 2. REMOVAL OF TRAVEL AGENCIES.

7 (a) CHANGE OF REGULATIONS.—Not later than 908 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary

of Labor shall revise the regulations set forth in section
779.317 of title 29, Code of Federal Regulations, to re move travel agencies from the partial list of establishments
having no retail concept.

5 (b) INTERIM EFFECT.—Until the Secretary com-6 pletes the revisions required by subsection (a) and not-7 withstanding section 779 of title 29, Code of Federal Reg-8 ulations, a travel agency shall not be considered an estab-9 lishment having no retail concept for the purposes of cer-10 tain exemptions under the Fair Labor Standards Act of 11 1938.
