3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Preserving Consumers"
- 5 Mortgage Origination Choices Act of 2011".

6 SEC. 2. COMPENSATION OF MORTGAGE ORIGINATORS BY 7 MORTGAGE BROKERS.

8 Subsection (c)(4) of section 129B of the Truth in
9 Lending Act (as added by Public Law 111–203) is amend10 ed by adding at the end the following new subparagraph:

1	"(E) prohibiting a mortgage broker from
2	compensating a mortgage originator based on
3	the principal amount of the loan, when com-
4	pensation is paid directly or indirectly to the
5	mortgage broker by the consumer in connection
6	with such transaction.".
7	SEC. 3. LIMITED REDUCTION IN MORTGAGE ORIGINATOR
8	COMPENSATION.
9	Section 129B of such Act is amended—
10	(1) by redesigning subsections (d), (e), and (f)
11	as subsections (e), (f), and (g), respectively; and
12	(2) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
13	lowing new subsection:
14	"(d) Limited Reduction in Mortgage Origi-
15	NATOR COMPENSATION.—When producing a mortgage, a
16	mortgage originator, when requested by a borrower, may
17	forfeit or contribute toward bona fide third party expenses
18	or origination fees no more than 30 percent of earned
19	compensation to avoid making a high-cost mortgage to a
20	consumer, to make technical corrections, or for any other
21	reason that results in a lower cost to the consumer than
22	if such forfeiture or contribution did not take place.".
