A BILL

- To amend title 10, United States Code, to permit additional retired members of the Armed Forces who have a serviceconnected disability to receive both disability compensation from the Department of Veterans Affairs for their disability and either retired pay by reason of their years of military service or combat-related special compensation.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Retired Pay Restora-3 tion Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND SENSE OF CONGRESS.

5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

6 (1) For more than 100 years before 1999, all
7 disabled military retirees were required to fund their
8 own veterans' disability compensation by forfeiting
9 one dollar of earned retired pay for each dollar re10 ceived in veterans' disability compensation.

(2) Since 1999, Congress has enacted legislation to progressively expand eligibility criteria for relief of the retired pay disability offset and reduce the
burden of financial sacrifice on disabled military retirees.

16 (3) Absent adequate funding to eliminate the
17 sacrifice for all disabled retirees, Congress has given
18 initial priority to easing financial inequities for the
19 most severely disabled and for combat-disabled retir20 ees.

(4) In the interest of maximizing eligibility
within cost constraints, Congress effectively has authorized full concurrent receipt for all qualifying retirees with 100-percent disability ratings and all
qualifying retirees with combat-related disability ratings, while phasing out the disability offset to retired

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pay over 10 years for retired members with noncom bat-related, service-connected disability ratings of 50
 percent to 90 percent.

4 (5) In pursuing these good-faith efforts, Con5 gress acknowledges the regrettable necessity of cre6 ating new thresholds of eligibility that understand7 ably are disappointing to disabled retirees who fall
8 short of meeting those new thresholds.

9 (6) Congress is not content with the status quo. 10 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-11 gress that military retired pay earned by service and sac-12 rifice in defending the United States should not be re-13 duced because a military retiree is also eligible for vet-14 erans' disability compensation awarded for service-con-15 nected disability.

6 (b) AMENDMENTS TO REFLECT CONCLUSION OF
7 PHASE-IN OF CONCURRENT RECEIPT OF RETIRED PAY
8 AND VETERANS' DISABILITY COMPENSATION.—Section
9 1414 of title 10, United States Code, is further amend10 ed—

(1) in subsection (a), as amended by subsection(a) of this section, by striking the final sentence;

(2) by striking subsection (c) and redesignating
subsections (d) and (e) as subsections (c) and (d),
respectively; and

16 (3) in subsection (d), as so redesignated, by17 striking paragraphs (3) and (4).

18 (c) SPECIFICATION OF QUALIFIED RETIREES FOR
19 CONCURRENT RECEIPT PURPOSES.—Section 1414 of title
20 10, United States Code, is further amended—

21 (1) in subsection (a), as amended by sub22 sections (a) and (b)—

(A) by striking "a member or" and all thatfollows through "is entitled" and inserting "an

3	(B) by inserting "retired pay and veterans"
4	disability compensation" after "both";
5	(2) in subsection (b)—
6	(A) by striking "Special Rules" in the
7	subsection heading and all that follows through
8	"is subject to" and inserting "SPECIAL RULES
9	FOR CHAPTER 61 DISABILITY RETIREES.—In
10	the case of a qualified retiree who is retired
11	under chapter 61 of this title, the retired pay
12	of the member is subject to"; and
13	(B) by striking paragraph (2); and
14	(3) in subsection (d), as redesignated and
15	amended by subsection (b), by adding at the end the
16	following new paragraph:
17	"(3) QUALIFIED RETIREE.—The term 'qualified
18	retiree' means a member or former member of the
19	uniformed services who, with respect to any
20	month—
21	"(A) is entitled to retired pay, other than
22	in the case of a member retired under chapter
23	61 of this title with less than 20 years of serv-
24	ice creditable under section 1405 of this title

1	and less than 20 years of service computed
2	under section 12732 of this title; and
3	"(B) is entitled to veterans' disability com-
4	pensation.".

20	(f) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
21	this section shall take effect as of January 1, 2020, and
22	shall apply to payments for months beginning on or after
23	that date.

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
