## A BILL

To prohibit non-security assistance to Pakistan, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring the Effective
- 5 Use of United States Aid to Pakistan Act".

### SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON PROVISION OF NON-SECURITY AS-2 SISTANCE TO PAKISTAN. 3 (a) Prohibition.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, assistance may not be provided to Pakistan 4 5 under any provision of law described in subsection (b). 6 (b) Provisions of Law.—The provisions of law re-7 ferred to in subsection (a) are the following: 8 (1) Sections 103, 105, 106, and sections 251 9 through 255, and chapter 10 of part I of the For-10 eign Assistance Act of 1961 ("Development Assist-11 ance"). 12 (2) Chapter 4 of part II of the Foreign Assist-13 ance Act ("Economic Support Fund"). 14 (3) Chapters 1 and 10 of part I of the Foreign 15 Assistance Act of 1961 for global health activities 16 ("Global Health and Child Survival"). 17 (4) The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 for the 18 promotion of democracy globally ("Democracy 19 Fund"). 20 (5) Section 491 of the Foreign Assistance Act 21 of 1961 ("International Disaster Assistance"). 22 (6) Any provision of law that authorizes the 23 Secretary of State to provide a contribution to the 24 International Committee of the Red Cross, assist-25 ance to refugees, including contributions to the

International Organization for Migration and the

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- United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees,
  and other activities to meet refugee and migration
  needs ("Migration and Refugee Assistance").
  - (7) Section 2(c) of the Migration and Refugee Assistance Act of 1962 ("United States Refugee and Migration Assistance Fund").
    - (8) Title I of the Food for Peace Act (7 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) (relating to sales of agricultural commodities for economic assistance and food security) and title II of the Food for Peace Act (7 U.S.C. 1721 et seq.) (relating to grants to provide agricultural commodities under emergency and private assistance programs).
    - (9) Section 416(b) of the Agricultural Act of 1949 (7 U.S.C. 1431(b)) (relating to furnishing agricultural commodities for carrying out programs of assistance in developing countries and friendly countries).
    - (10) Title I of the Enhanced Partnership with Pakistan Act of 2009 (relating to democratic, economic, and development assistance for Pakistan).
  - (11) Any other related or similar provision of law, including any provision of law authorizing contributions to international organizations.

1	(c) APPLICABILITY.—The prohibition on assistance
2	to Pakistan under section 2(c) of the Migration and Ref-
3	ugee Assistance Act of 1962, as described in subsection
4	(b)(7) of this section, shall apply notwithstanding section
5	2(f) of the Migration and Refugee Assistance Act of 1962.
6	SEC. 3. REQUIREMENTS FOR PROVISION OF SECURITY AS-
7	SISTANCE TO PAKISTAN.
8	(a) Requirements.—Assistance may be provided to
9	Pakistan under any provision of law other than the provi-
10	sions of law described in section 2(b) only during a period
11	for which a certification described in subsection (b) or a
12	recertification described in subsection (c) is in effect.
13	(b) CERTIFICATION.—A certification referred to in
14	subsection (a) is a certification transmitted by the Presi-
15	dent to Congress that contains a determination of the
16	President that the Government of Pakistan—
17	(1) is cooperating with the United States in ef-
18	forts against Al Qaeda, the Taliban, and associated
19	terrorist groups, including prevention of such groups
20	from carrying out cross-border attacks on neigh-
21	boring countries;
22	(2) does not impede United States counterter-
23	rorism efforts; and
24	(3) will use the assistance solely for the purpose
25	of border security, counter-terrorism, and law en-

- 1 forcement activities directed against Al Qaeda, the
  2 Taliban, and associated terrorist groups.
  3 (c) Recertifications.—Not later than 90 days
  4 after the date on which the President transmits to Con-
- 5 gress an initial certification under subsection (b), and
- 6 every 6 months thereafter—
- 7 (1) the President shall transmit to Congress a 8 recertification that the conditions described in sub-9 section (b) are continuing to be met; or
- 10 (2) if the President is unable to make such a 11 recertification, the President shall transmit to Con-12 gress a report that contains the reasons therefor.
- 13 (d) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—The conditions de-14 scribed in subsection (b) are in addition to the conditions 15 contained in any provision of law other than the provisions 16 of law described in section 2(b) for the provision of assist-
- 17 ance to Pakistan.

#### 18 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- (a) In General.—This Act takes effect on the dateof the enactment of this Act.
- 21 (b) Applicability.—
- 22 (1) SECTION 2.—Section 2 applies with respect 23 to amounts allocated for assistance to Pakistan 24 under the provisions of law described in section 2(b) 25 on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.

1 (2) SECTION 3.—Section 3 applies with respect
2 to amounts allocated for assistance to Pakistan
3 under any provision of law other than the provisions
4 of law described in section 2(b) for each fiscal year
5 beginning on or after the date of the enactment of
6 this Act.

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
