## A BILL

To amend the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 to provide families year-round access to nutrition incentives, including hard-to-serve areas, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supporting all Healthy  
5 Options when Purchasing Produce Act” or the “SHOPP  
6 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. NUTRITION INCENTIVES.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 4405 of the Food, Con-  
3 servation, and Energy Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 7517) is  
4 amended—

5 (1) in subsection (b)(2)(B)—

6 (A) by redesignating clauses (ix) and (x)  
7 as clauses (x) and (xi); and

8 (B) by inserting after clause (viii) the fol-  
9 lowing:

10 “(ix) increase year-round availability  
11 of incentives by offering fresh frozen fruits  
12 or vegetables;” and

13 (2) in subsection (c), by striking “fresh fruits  
14 and vegetables” and inserting “fresh or fresh frozen  
15 fruits, vegetables, and legumes” each place it ap-  
16 pears.

17 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
18 this section shall take effect on March 6, 2024.
