To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow the energy investment tax credit for electrochromic glass.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Dynamic Glass Act
- 5 of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF ELECTROCHROMIC GLASS AS EN-
- 7 ERGY PROPERTY FOR PURPOSES OF INVEST-
- 8 MENT TAX CREDIT.
- 9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 48(a)(2)(A)(i) of the In-
- 10 ternal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by striking

1	"and" at the end of subclause (III) and by adding at the
2	end the following new subclause:
3	"(V) energy property described in
4	paragraph (3)(A)(viii), and".
5	(b) Electrochromic Glass Described.—Section
6	48(a)(3)(A) of such Code is amended by striking "or" at
7	the end of clause (vi), by adding "or" at the end of clause
8	(vii), and by adding at the end the following new clause
9	"(viii) glass which uses electricity to
10	change its light transmittance properties in
11	order to heat or cool a structure, but only
12	with respect to property the construction
13	of which begins before January 1, 2022."
14	(c) Phaseout.—Section 48(a)(6) of such Code is
15	amended—
16	(1) by striking "paragraph (3)(A)(i)" each
17	place it appears and inserting "clause (i) or (viii) of
18	paragraph (3)(A)", and
19	(2) by inserting "AND ELECTROCHROMIC
20	GLASS" after "SOLAR ENERGY PROPERTY".
21	(d) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
22	this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
23	the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
