## A BILL

To require preference to be given to applicants for health profession opportunity grants under section 2008 of the Social Security Act who have certain kinds of business and community partners.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Making Opportunities
- 5 Reachable for Everyone Act" or the "MORE Act".

1	SEC. 2. PREFERENCE FOR HEALTH PROFESSION OPPOR-
2	TUNITY GRANT APPLICANTS WHO HAVE CER-
3	TAIN KINDS OF BUSINESS AND COMMUNITY
4	PARTNERS.
5	Section 2008 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
6	1397g) is amended by redesignating subsections (c) and
7	(d) as subsections (d) and (e), respectively, and inserting
8	after subsection (b) the following:
9	"(c) Preference for Grant Applicants Who
10	HAVE CERTAIN PARTNERS.—In considering applications
11	for a grant under this section, the Secretary shall give
12	preference to applications submitted by applicants who
13	have business and community partners in each of the fol-
14	lowing categories:
15	"(1) State and local government agencies and
16	social service providers;
17	"(2) institutions of higher education, and local
18	workforce development boards established under sec-
19	tion 107 of the Workforce Innovation and Oppor-
20	tunity Act; and
21	"(3) health care employers, labor unions, and
22	labor-management partnerships.".
23	SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
24	The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
25	on October 1, 2019.
