Mr. POSEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Reform, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

### A BILL

To sunset new Federal regulatory rules after 3 years, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Article I Restoration5 Act of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. SUNSET OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS AFTER 3 7 YEARS.

8 (a) SUNSET.—Any covered rule issued by an agency9 after the date of the enactment of this Act shall sunset

on the date that is three years after the effective date of
 such covered rule, unless specifically reauthorized by an
 Act of Congress.

4 (b) AFTER SUNSET.—An agency may not reissue, en5 force, revise, or take other regulatory action related to a
6 covered rule that has sunset under subsection (a).

7 (c) OVERSIGHT BY OMB AND HEADS OF AGEN8 CIES.—The Director of the Office of Management and
9 Budget or the head of the relevant agency may oversee
10 the sunset of covered rules under subsection (a).

## SEC. 3. SUBMISSION OF REQUEST FOR REAUTHORIZATION TO CONGRESS.

(a) REQUEST FOR REAUTHORIZATION.—If the head
of an agency that issues covered rules wants to request
a reauthorization for such rules, such head shall, not later
than the December 1 that is one year before the date on
which the covered rule is scheduled to sunset, submit to
Congress and any appropriate committee of Congress a
report containing such request that includes—

- 20 (1) a justification for the reauthorization of21 each covered rule;
- 22 (2) any related covered rules; and

23 (3) any recommendation or request made by the
24 chair or ranking member of an appropriate com25 mittee of Congress.

(b) SINGLE SUBMISSION.—The head of an agency
 submitting a request for reauthorization under subsection
 (a) shall make every effort to bundle multiple requests for
 reauthorization in a single submission.

5 (c) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF REPORTS.—Any report
6 submitted by the head of an agency under subsection (a)
7 shall be published on the public website of the agency.

# 8 SEC. 4. RELATIONSHIP TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCE9 DURE.

10 Nothing in this Act shall be construed to supersede
11 the provisions of chapter 5, 6, or 7 of title 5, United States
12 Code.

#### 13 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

14 In this Act:

(1) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
meaning given that term in section 551 of title 5,
United States Code.

18 (2) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term "Adminis19 trator" means the Administrator of the Office of In20 formation and Regulatory Affairs in the Office of
21 Management and Budget.

(3) COVERED RULE.—The term "covered rule"
has the meaning given the term "rule" in section
551 of title 5, United States Code, but does not include a rule—

(A) issued in accordance with the formal
rulemaking provisions of sections 556 and 557
of title 5, United States Code;
(B) issued with respect to a military or
foreign affairs function of the United States;
(C) that the Administrator certifies in
writing is necessary for the enforcement of Fed-
eral criminal laws;
(D) that is limited to agency organization,
management, or personnel matters; or
(E) that is necessary due to an imminent
threat to human health or safety or any other
emergency.
(4) SUNSET.—The term "sunset" means to
have no force or effect.
