A BILL

To extend the termination date for the exemption of returning workers from the numerical limitations for temporary workers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Save Our Small and
- 5 Seasonal Businesses Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF RETURNING WORKER EXEMPTION
- 7 TO H-2B NUMERICAL LIMITATION.
- 8 (a) In General.—Section 214(g)(9)(A) of the Im-
- 9 migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1184(g)(9)(A))
- 10 is amended by striking "an alien who has already been

- 1 counted toward the numerical limitation of paragraph
- 2 (1)(B) during fiscal year 2004, 2005, or 2006 shall not
- 3 again be counted toward such limitation during fiscal year
- 4 2007." and inserting "an alien who has been present in
- 5 the United States as an H-2B nonimmigrant during any
- 6 1 of the 3 fiscal years immediately preceding the fiscal
- 7 year of the approved start date of a petition for a non-
- 8 immigrant worker described in section
- 9 101(a)(15)(H)(ii)(b) shall not be counted toward such lim-
- 10 itation for the fiscal year in which the petition is approved.
- 11 Such alien shall be considered a returning worker.".
- 12 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 13 subsection (a) shall take effect as if enacted on October
- 14 1, 2011.
