## A BILL

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Small Business Growth3 and Federal Accountability Act of 2012".

### 4 SEC. 2. SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION IN PROCURE-5 MENT CONTRACTS.

6 (a) Consequence for Failure To Meet Goal.— 7 If a Federal department or agency does not meet a covered 8 goal with respect to a fiscal year, that department or agen-9 cy, in the succeeding fiscal year, may not expend for the procurement of goods or services an amount that is great-10 11 er than 90 percent of the amount expended for the pro-12 curement of goods or services in the fiscal year with re-13 spect to which that department or agency did not meet the covered goal. 14

(b) PREFERENCE.—To meet a covered goal, the head
of a Federal department or agency may give preference
to a small business concern when procuring goods or services.

19 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following defi-20 nitions apply:

(1) COVERED GOAL.—The term "covered goal"
means a goal established by the head of a Federal
department or agency—

24 (A) under section 15(g) of the Small Busi25 ness Act (15 U.S.C. 644(g)); and

 business concerns in the procurement contracts
 of that department or agency.

4 (2) SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN.—The term
