4 This Act may be cited as "Kate's Law" or as the

3 Section 276 of the Immigration and Nationality Act
4 (8 U.S.C. 1326) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a), in the matter following
6 paragraph (2) by striking "fined under title 18,
7 United States Code, or imprisoned not more than 2
8 years, or both" and inserting "imprisoned not less
9 than 5 years and not more than 6 years"; and

10 (2) in subsection (b)—

(A) in paragraph (1), by striking "fined
under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned
not more than 10 years, or both" and inserting
"imprisoned not less than 5 and not more than
10 years, and may, in addition, be fined under
title 18, United States Code";

(B) in paragraph (2), by striking "fined
under such title, imprisoned not more than 20
years, or both" and inserting "imprisoned not
less than 5 and not more than 20 years and
may, in addition, be fined under such title";

(C) in paragraph (4), by striking "fined
under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned
for not more than 10 years, or both" and inserting "imprisoned for not less than 5 and not
