# A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize the Operation Stonegarden grant program, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Operation Stonegarden
- 5 Authorization Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. OPERATION STONEGARDEN.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title XX of the
- 8 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 601 et seq.)
- 9 is amended by adding at the end the following new section:

#### 1 "SEC. 2009. OPERATION STONEGARDEN.

- 2 "(a) Establishment.—There is established in the
- 3 Department a program to be known as 'Operation
- 4 Stonegarden', under which the Secretary, acting through
- 5 the Administrator, shall make grants to eligible law en-
- 6 forcement agencies, through the State administrative
- 7 agency, to enhance border security in accordance with this
- 8 section.
- 9 "(b) Eligible Recipients.—To be eligible to re-
- 10 ceive a grant under this section, a law enforcement agen-
- 11 cy—
- "(1) shall be located in—
- 13 "(A) a State bordering Canada or Mexico;
- 14 or
- 15 "(B) a State or territory with a maritime
- border; and
- 17 "(2) shall be involved in an active, ongoing,
- 18 U.S. Customs and Border Protection operation co-
- ordinated through a U.S. Border Patrol sector of-
- 20 fice.
- 21 "(c) Permitted Uses.—The recipient of a grant
- 22 under this section may use such grant for—
- "(1) equipment, including maintenance and
- 24 sustainment costs;

- 1 "(2) personnel, including overtime and backfill,
- 2 in support of enhanced border law enforcement ac-
- 3 tivities;
- 4 "(3) any activity permitted for Operation
- 5 Stonegarden under the Department of Homeland
- 6 Security's most recent Homeland Security Grant
- 7 Program Notice of Funding Opportunity; and
- 8 "(4) any other appropriate activity, as deter-
- 9 mined by the Administrator, in consultation with the
- 10 Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protec-
- 11 tion.
- 12 "(d) Period of Performance.—The Secretary
- 13 shall award grants under this section to grant recipients
- 14 for a period of not less than 36 months.
- 15 "(e) Report.—For each of the fiscal years 2020
- 16 through 2024, the Administrator shall submit to the Com-
- 17 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
- 18 of the Senate and the Committee on Homeland Security
- 19 of the House of Representatives a report that contains in-
- 20 formation on the expenditure of grants made under this
- 21 section by each grant recipient.
- 22 "(f) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 23 is authorized to be appropriated \$110,000,000 for each
- 24 of the fiscal years 2020 through 2024 for grants under
- 25 this section.".

- 1 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Subsection (a) of
- 2 section 2002 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6)
- 3 U.S.C. 603) is amended to read as follows:
- 4 "(a) Grants Authorized.—The Secretary, through
- 5 the Administrator, may award grants under sections 2003,
- 6 2004, and 2009 to State, local, and Tribal governments,
- 7 as appropriate.".
- 8 (c) Clerical Amendment.—The table of contents
- 9 in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is
- 10 amended by inserting after the item relating to section
- 11 2008 the following new item:

"Sec. 2009. Operation Stonegarden.".

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
